On ballots this spring, voters will be asked "shall section 1m of article III of the constitution be created to require that voters present valid photographic identification verifying their identity in order to vote in any election, subject to exceptions which may be established by law?"

If approved, the state Constitution would be changed to include the provision that "no qualified elector may cast a ballot in any election unless the elector presents valid photographic identification that verifies the elector's identity and that is issued by this state, the federal government, a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band in this state, or a college or university in this state."

The provision would give the Legislature the authority to determine which types of ID qualify as acceptable.

Current law includes state is-

sued driver's licenses and photo IDs, U.S. Passports, military IDs and unexpired university IDs (expired student IDs are allowed if proof of current enrollment such as a tuition receipt or course schedule is provided).

Rev. Dr. Jamal Bryant's Black Church Target Boycott Mobilizes 150,000!

Rev. Dr. Jamal Harrison Bryant, an Atlanta-based pastor of the New Birth Baptist Church, has reported a robust national turnout for his consumer boycott against Minneapolis-based retail giant Target.

The fast-selective-buying campaign, which began during the Lent Season from March 5 to April 17, targets what Bryant describes as the company's neglect of the Black community.

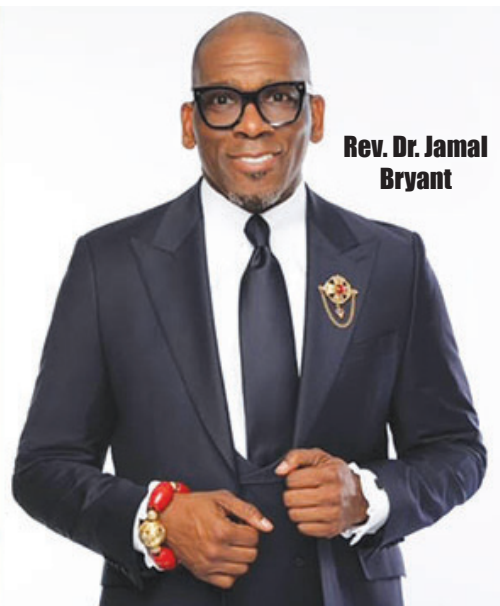
According to Bryant, the boycott has mobilized over 150,000 participants and persuaded over 100 Black vendors to withdraw their products from Target.

The movement has led to a \$12 drop per share in Target's stock and a \$2 billion decrease in its overall value.

"We just hit 150 thousand people who have signed up to be part of it, with over 100 black vendors that pulled out of Target, so the momentum is going steadily," Bryant explained.

"In the tradition of Richard Allen, Frederick Douglass, Harriet Tubman, and the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., we are pleased to state for the sake of historical accuracy that Jamal Bryant is today the personification of the prophetic tradition of the Black Church," — Benjamin F. Chavis, Jr., NNPA President/CEO

The NAACP and the National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA), representing the Black Press of America, have simultaneously announced the planning and implementation of a national public education and selective buying campaign in response to Tar-

get and other corporations that have dismantled their respective Diversity, Equity, and Inclusion (DEI) commitments, programs and staffing.

"Now is the time for the Black Press of America once again to speak and publish truth to power emphatically," NNPA Chairman Emeritus Danny Bakewell Sr. explained.

NNPA Chairman Bobby R. Henry Sr. added, "We are the trusted voice of Black America, and we will not be silent or nonresponsive to the rapid rise of renewed Jim Crow racist policies in corporate America."

"The Black Press of America continues to remain on the frontline keeping our families and communities informed and engaged on all the issues that impact our quality of life," Henry noted.

Despite the traction, Bryant revealed that there had been no communication or planned meetings with Target.

He humorously speculated that the White House may have encouraged Target officials to avoid meeting with civil rights groups.

"No, we're waiting. As we understand it, the administration is trying to get them not to meet and is hoping that this is just going to taper off," Bryant remarked.

"But unless President [Trump] is in trouble and buys a whole bunch of toilet paper, I don't know what they expect the White House to do for them."

Bryant also discussed the Black Church leadership's historical and present role in

The quality of education for Milwaukee students has deteriorated over the past 20 years, with the racial academic achievement gap widening and reading proficiency rates soaring.

One of the widest gaps occurred during the reign of state Superintendent Jill Underly, whose only remedy was to lower testing standards.

That's why a who's who of Black educators and civic activists have endorsed 'reform' candidate Brittany Kinser for state superintendent of the Department of Public Instruction.

From John Daniels to Dr. Howard Fuller to Colleston Morgan, the list of Kinser supporters leaves little doubt about the importance of next Tuesday's election and our participation in that life-altering process.

In a nutshell, it's up to us to tear down the educational apartheid walls by casting our vote for Kinser, whose unique background in educational innovation and myriad leadership experiences will serve our children best.

In fact, the election will determine the future of our city. If our children continue suffering from educational mediocrity, you can spell MKE, D.E.T.R.O.I.T.--Check that; even Detroit scores better on educational tests than MKE.

Kinser is not a miracle worker and isn't armed with Thor's hammer.

But her resume speaks to her being a valued change agent, and equally important, she has a history of focusing on the needs of the un-

derserved. Her track record attests to her prioritizing the needs of the poor and minority students.

I have talked several times with Kinser and walked away impressed. In fact, I hesitated to leave her presence 'boarding' Daniels and, most recently, educator Gerald Randall for follow-up questions. Both indicated they were worried for the city's future if change isn't around the corner. Colleston provided a data sheet that predicted a morbid future if the educational system is not updated and reformed.

Sadly, too many folks are satisfied with the failing status quo or afraid of the special interests that control not only state politics but also the local school board and common council. For the record, the state legislature has a constitutional responsibility for education, and the school board was subject to a recall last year.

But not enough victims---or the parents of victims (who should be charged with child abuse for not engaging in their children's education) are willing to take the earplugs out of their sockets---and challenge the status quo. As a result, we have a generation of failure reminiscent of reconstruction.

Far too many Milwaukee leaders and state politicians are either satisfied with the current failing system or have a vested interest in maintaining the failing status quo to speak up. They are also fearful of special interests running candidates against them.

Kinser has successfully worked with poor and minority children, primarily students who have been shortchanged by systems that consider them castoffs, incorrigible

(\$\$\$) statistics, or unable to master the basics of reading and writing. (They love to blame poverty for failure).

If we could force Underly to sit for an interview, the first question I would ask is, 'How can the head of education for the state of Wisconsin sit on her hands as the largest district has the worst Black reading proficiency rates in the country?'

Are you embarrassed that our fourth and eighth-grade reading proficiency rates are lower than those of the Comoros, China, and Czechia? Don't trust me; look it up.

According to the late State Rep. Polly Williams, if there is nothing wrong with the children, it's obvious something is wrong with the system. And the parents.

In my four decades of observations, research, and interviews, I have found nothing wrong with our children.

I would be remiss not to note that poor Black children brought up in two-parent families are more likely

to excel regardless of the system.

In fact, children brought up in educated single-parent households do just as well.

I can testify to that fact. My son was an honor student at Messmer.

His son, raised by a single mother after his death, was accepted into the most prestigious academy in the county. He was an honor student at MSOE and is now working on his master's degree.

America's civil rights and social justice movements. "The Black Church has always been the heartbeat and the epicenter of the civil rights movement," he said, acknowledging the changing perceptions among younger generations regarding the church's involvement in social justice.

Bryant called for continued focus and support from the community to maintain the boycott's impact. "It is critical that Black people can't afford to get A.D.D; we can't taper off and lose synergy.

It's important that people stay the course and keep amplifying our voices because it is being heard from Wall

Street to Main Street," he urged. NNPA President & CEO Dr. Benjamin F. Chavis Jr. said he's known and witnessed the national and international rise of the Black Church leadership and commitment to Bryant.

"In the tradition of Richard Allen, Frederick Douglass, Harriet Tubman, and the Rev. Dr. Martin Luther King Jr., we are pleased to state for the sake of historical accuracy that Jamal Bryant is today the personification of the prophetic tradition of the Black Church," Chavis remarked.

"We in the Black Press of America stand in rigid solidarity with Rev. Dr. Bryant as we target campaign Target's egregious disrespect of Black America."

introduced remedies or called for an accountability study or assessment during her tenure. Even Governor Tony Evers has questioned her policies.

However, she has stayed on the telephone with special interests that fund her campaign and have a vested interest in maintaining the failing status quo.

And, oh yes, she found a solution by sending her child to private school while declaring Black children should not have that option. Underly admitted as much on Dr. Ken Harris's radio talk show.

And the cherry on the top was her declaration that she was privileged, stressing that we---Black people---were not.

I'm not making that up; not only was that an insult, but it bordered on being racist.

Many people used that 'r' word to describe her comments. I won't brand her any more than I would the administrators who run MPS.

But as some suggest, the proof is in the pudding (and it's not chitterlins juice).

The bottom line is the current system does not work for a majority---that's over 56%---of Black children.

We can continue to ignore or bury our heads in the Lake Michigan sand, but the bottom line is Milwaukee's future does not bode well.

If 50 plus percent of Black students can't read beyond an eighth-grade level, 40% won't graduate at all, and the majority are destined for service industry jobs, you don't have to have a PhD to figure out why the cashier at McDonald's could figure out the correct change for your purchase without a calculator or calling in the manager.

I'm not putting the entire blame on the teachers, superintendent, or the school board. Hopefully, the new MPS superintendent will have the testicles to battle the special interests or tear down the apartheid walls.

It's more likely that change will filter down, meaning the state superintendent will do what's necessary to bring about change rather than lower testing standards to make it appear that failing students are scholars.

But that will only happen if we vote for Kinser over the Underly.

If you vote for the failing status quo over Kinser, next Tuesday will be April Fool's Day---make that day and decades.---Hotep.

Notice of Spring Election, Special Election, and Sample Ballots April 1, 2025

OFFICE OF THE MILWAUKEE COUNTY ELECTION COMMISSION

TO THE VOTERS OF THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE:

Notice is hereby given of a spring election and a special election to be held in City of Milwaukee on April 1, 2025, at which the officers named below shall be chosen. The names of the candidates for each office, whose nominations have been certified to or filed in this office, are given under the title of the office, each in its proper column, together with the questions submitted to a vote, for a referendum, if any, in the sample ballot below.

Information to Voters

Upon entering the polling place and before being permitted to vote, a voter shall:

- state their name and address
show an acceptable form of photo identification*
sign the poll book**

*If a voter does not have acceptable photo identification, the voter may obtain a free photo ID for voting from the Division of Motor Vehicles.

**If the voter is unable to sign the poll book due to disability, a poll worker may write the word "exempt."

If a voter is not registered to vote, they may register to vote at the polling place serving their residence if the voter provides proof of residence.

Where ballots are distributed to voters, the initials of two inspectors must appear on the ballot.

Upon being permitted to vote, the voter shall enter a voting booth or go to a machine and cast their ballot. The vote should not be cast in any manner other than specified here. Sample ballots or other materials to assist the voter in marking their ballot may be taken into the booth and copied. The sample ballot shall not be shown to anyone so as to reveal how the ballot is marked.

A voter who is a parent or guardian may be accompanied by the voter's minor child or minor ward.

An election official may inform the voter of the proper manner for casting a vote, but the official may not advise or indicate a particular voting choice.

Assistance for Voting

A voter may select an individual to assist in casting their vote if the voter declares to the presiding official that they are unable to read, have difficulty reading, writing, or understanding English, or that due to disability are unable to cast their ballot. The selected individual rendering assistance may not be the voter's employer or an agent of that employer or an officer or agent of a labor organization which represents the voter.

Where Optical Scan Voting is Used

The voter shall fill in the oval next to the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall write in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote and fill in the oval next to the write-in line. On referendum questions, the voter shall fill in the oval next to "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall fill in the oval next to "no" if opposed to the question.

When using an electronic ballot marking device ("ExpressVote") to mark an optical scan ballot, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select the name of the candidate of their choice for each office for which they intend to vote. To vote for a person whose name does not appear on the ballot, the voter shall type in the name of the person of their choice in the space provided for a write-in vote. On referendum questions, the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select "yes" if in favor of the question, or the voter shall touch the screen or use the tactile pad to select "no" if opposed to the question.

Spoiling Ballots

If a voter spoils an optical scan ballot, they shall return it to an election official who shall issue another ballot in its place, but not more than three ballots shall be issued to any one voter. If the ballot has not been initialed by two inspectors or is defective in any other way, the voter shall return it to the election official, who shall issue a proper ballot in its place.

After Voting the Ballot

After an official optical scan ballot is marked, it may be inserted in the security sleeve, so the marks do not show. The voter shall insert the ballot in the voting device and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. If a central count system is used, the voter shall insert the ballot in the ballot box and discard the sleeve or deliver the ballot to an inspector for deposit. The voter shall leave the polling place promptly.

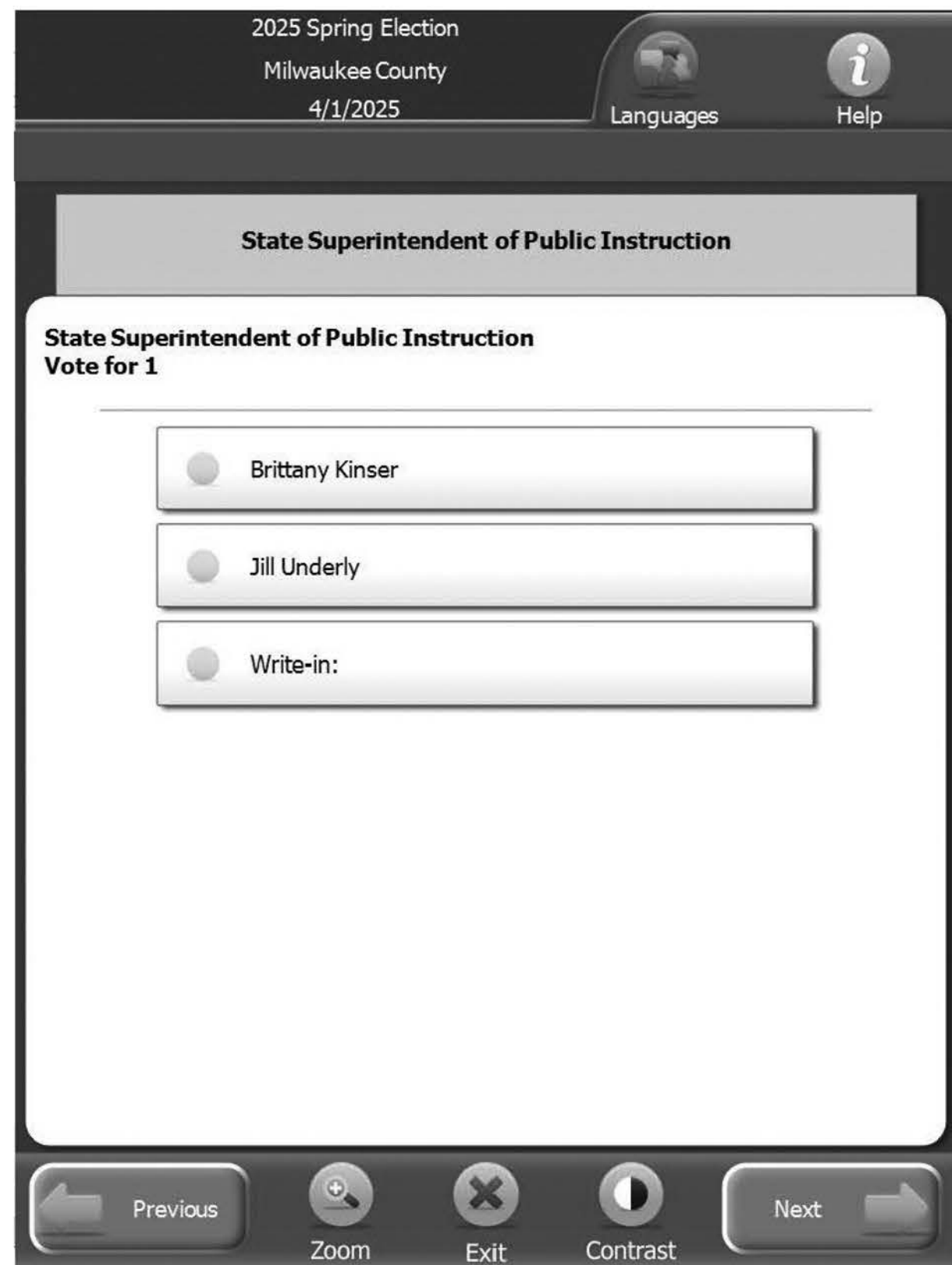

The Plot to Assassinate Black America!

Trump has launched the most dangerous attack on Black people since the 1960s

Not since the 1960s have Black Americans been the target of a greater political assault than the one we’re witnessing right now.

Donald Trump just installed a white supremacist at the State Department who openly acknowledged his belief that “white men must be in charge” of everything.

He put in another at the Treasury Department, who called to repeal the Civil Rights Act, “normalize Indian hate,” and eliminate Gaza, while bragging, “I was racist before it was cool.”

He put an unqualified Fox News host in charge of the entire Defense Department, even after the man was flagged by a service member as an “insider threat” and a possible white supremacist.

He’s installing a man to run the Department of Health and Human Services who believes that Black people should not be given the same vaccines as white people.

And he gave unprecedented government access to an unelected white South African billionaire who performs Nazi salutes, tells far-right Germans to let go of their Hitler guilt, and is coercing Black leaders in South Africa because he thinks white people are being persecuted.

Racism is not a bug in Trump’s vision of America, it is a feature, and the racists are not trying to hide it. Just since Inauguration Day, we’ve seen white supremacists on the subway in Washington, DC., Patriot Front members at the Jefferson Memorial, and “Proud Boys” marching through the streets of the capital. And now a right-wing group has published the names and photos of mostly Black federal workers in an alarming new “DEI watchlist” that effectively puts a target on their backs.

These are the people Donald Trump is empowering.

Trump’s mission is to dismantle decades, if not centuries, of civil rights progress in government, business, academia, and culture.

In government, he’s rescinding executive orders that have protected Black people since the 1960s and trying to eliminate the constitutional protection of birthright citizenship from the 1860s.

In business, he’s pressuring companies to end their diversity, equity, and inclusion programs, and far too many are willingly responding with “anticipatory obedience.”

In academia, he’s threatening to investigate colleges and universities with DEI programs and withhold federal funding for schools that promote racial justice, and now Rutgers University has canceled an HBCU conference and Harvard has laid off the staff of its Slavery Remembrance Program.

And in the culture, even the NFL removed its “End Racism” sign at the Super Bowl, the first time since 2021 without the message in the end zone, although the league unconvincingly denied that it was connected to Trump’s attendance at the game.

One year ago, I wrote a book called “Why Does Everything Have to Be About Race?” that warned about 5 features of modern racism: (1) erasing Black history, (2) centering white victimhood, (3) denying Black oppression, (4) promoting myths of Black inferiority, and (5) rebranding racism. Trump is doing all five in his first month in office.

His Defense Department banned Black History Month events and removed a video about the Tuskegee Airmen, while the Veterans Affairs office told a Black official not to mention DEI during an MLK event, all of which erase Black history.

His sweeping pardons for hundreds of January 6 insurrectionists, lesser known pardons for two white police officers who murdered a Black man, and his campaign to bring back Confederate names on military bases all center a racist misperception of white victimhood.

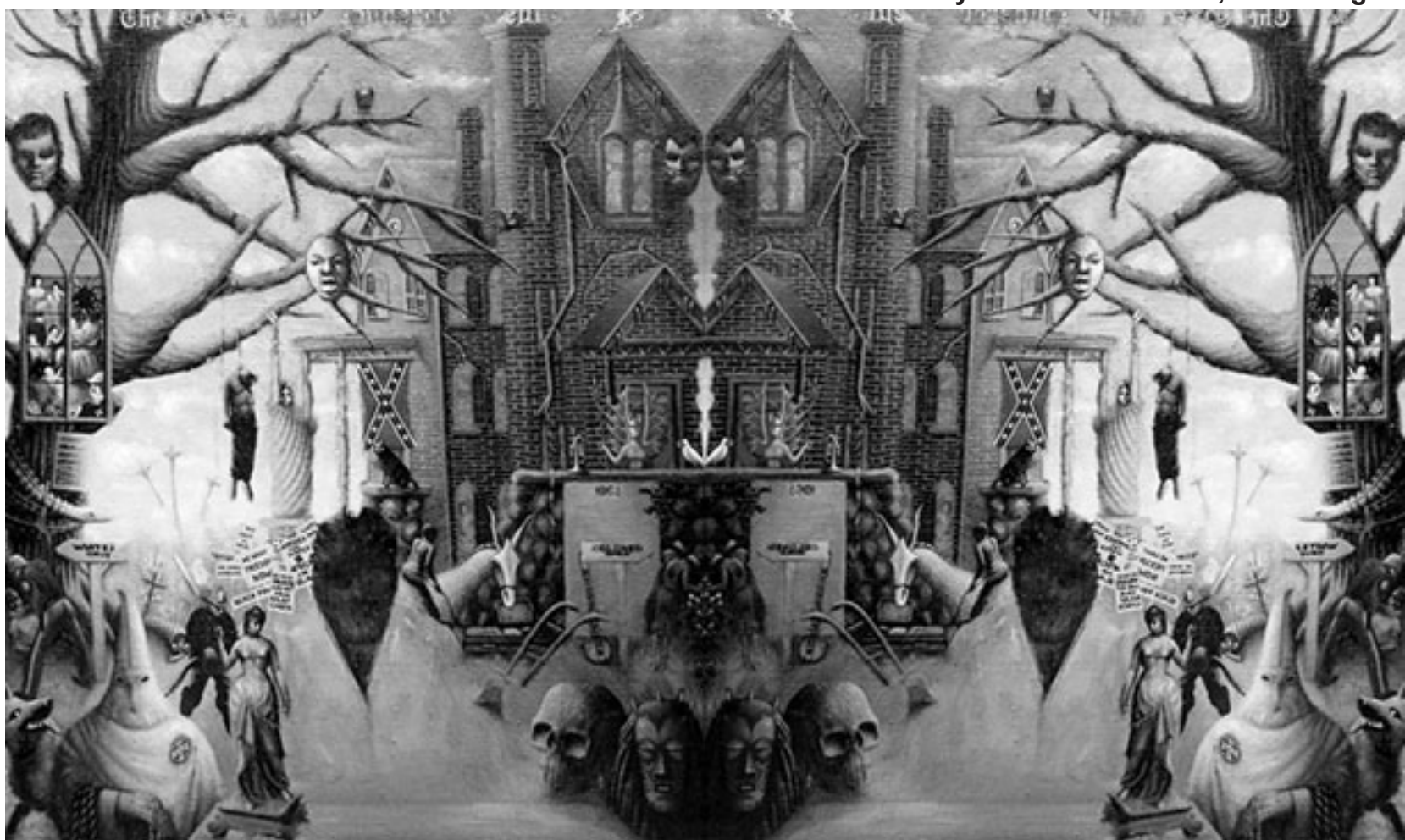

His rescission of decades-old civil rights executive orders fuels right-wing denial of Black oppression.

His reckless attack on DEI immediately after the DC plane crash promotes discriminatory myths of Black inferiority.

And his coded language gaslighting us about “meritocracy,” from a man who was the first president elected with no experience in government or military and then became the first criminal to be elected, represents a stunning example of rebranding racism.

So why isn’t anybody stopping him? How is he getting away with this?

Because Trump’s Republican Party now controls all three branches of government. The executive branch is run by Trump and his minions. Both houses of Congress, the legislative branch, are controlled by Republicans. And six of the nine members of the Supreme Court, the leaders of the judicial branch, were appointed by Republican presidents.

This is why many of us have been screaming for years that elections have consequences, and when we don’t vote in all federal, state, and local elections, we lose.

But as a Black American, it’s hard not to reach the conclusion that

Homeownership stands as a cornerstone of the American dream, providing individuals and families with the opportunity to accumulate wealth and maintain relatively consistent housing costs over time.

The financial stability derived from homeownership is regarded as a key avenue for economic advancement and security.

However, the realization of these benefits has not been uniform across demographic groups.

These disparities, particularly along racial lines, have persisted for decades, resulting in substantial wealth gaps and reduced financial security among various minority groups.

The affordability of homeownership is now further strained due to a persistent undersupply of housing resulting from more than a decade of low levels of residential construction.

Limited housing inventory has driven up home prices, creating additional barriers for lower-income buyers—who are disproportionately people of color.

portunately people of color.

While the minority homeownership gap has narrowed since 2000, these affordability challenges threaten to slow or even reverse that progress.

Elevated mortgage interest rates and systemic disparities in access to credit continue to make homeownership less attainable for many minority households, even as overall homeownership rates have improved.

As cities across the U.S. struggle with housing shortages and high costs, sustaining and further

closing the racial homeownership gap will continue to be a critical challenge.

The minority homeownership gap—defined here as the difference between the White homeownership rate and the minority homeownership rate—has exceeded 20 percentage points for at least the past two decades.

While the gap narrowed slightly during the housing bubble of the early 2000s, it widened following the housing market crash in 2008.

The financial crisis and sub-

sequent recession disproportionately impacted minority communities, leading to higher rates of foreclosure and home loss compared to their White counterparts. As a result, the gap remained wide throughout much of the 2010s.

Unlike past economic downturns, the COVID-19 recession proved to be an exception in its impact on minority homeownership.

A combination of rapid economic recovery, government sti-

ulus programs, and targeted housing support helped minority households regain financial stability more quickly than in previous crises.

Between 2016 and 2020, the minority homeownership rate steadily increased from 46.0% to 51.0%, while the White homeownership rate rose from 71.3% to 73.1%.

This growth continued into 2021 and 2022, with the minority homeownership rate reaching 51.4% and the White homeownership rate peaking at 73.4%.

However, since then, both minority and White homeownership rates have plateaued. The minority homeownership rate remained at 51.4% in 2023, while the White homeownership rate dipped slightly to 73.2%.

This plateau comes as home prices and mortgage rates have surged, making it more difficult for first-time buyers—particularly those from lower-income and historically disadvantaged groups—to enter the housing market.

While the minority homeownership gap remains smaller than it was in the early 2010s, the lack of recent progress highlights the continuing challenges in achieving racial parity.

Despite the overall minority homeownership gap narrowing to below 22 percentage points, the gap varies widely by race and ethnicity.

Among the nation's largest minority groups, Asians and Pacific Islanders have the highest rates of homeownership at 63.3%, followed by American Indian and Alaskan Natives at 57.2%.

Hispanic and Black Americans have the lowest homeownership rates, at just 51.0% and 45.0%, respectively.

Even with recent improvements, the homeownership gap between Black and White Americans is actually wider today than it was in the 1960s when it was legal to refuse to sell a home to someone because of their race.

More so than other demographic groups, Black Americans were hit especially hard by the housing crisis in 2008 because they more frequently purchased homes at the height of the bubble and were disproportionately the victims of subprime lending.

The minority homeownership gap varies across the U.S. due to factors such as local demographic makeup, housing costs, employment opportunities, and historical homeownership rates.

On a regional basis, the minority homeownership gap is largest in the Midwest and Northeast. North Dakota and New York report the largest differences between White and non-White homeownership at 36.8 and 30.2 percentage points, respectively.

These are the only two states where the gap exceeds 30 percentage points. Other states with large gaps include Rhode Island (29.5pp), Connecticut (29.4pp), and New Jersey (29.1pp).

Conversely, Hawaii remains the only state in which the minority homeownership rate actually exceeds that of White residents. More than 63% of minority households own their homes in Hawaii, compared to approximately 57% of White households.

Similar trends hold true at the local level, with metropolitan areas in the Midwest and Northeast reporting the most significant disparities in homeownership rates.

Among the nation's largest 100 metros, Worcester, MA; Cleveland, OH; and New Haven, CT have the largest gaps—all exceeding 31 percentage points.

At the opposite end of the spectrum, metropolitan areas in Hawaii, Texas, and California—such as Honolulu, HI; El Paso, TX; McAllen, TX; San Francisco, CA; and San Jose, CA—stand out for having some of the smallest differences in homeownership between minority and non-minority communities.

Methodology

To determine the locations with the largest minority homeownership gap, researchers at Construction Coverage analyzed the latest data from the U.S. Census Bureau's 2023 American Community Survey. The researchers ranked metros according to the minority homeownership gap, defined as the percentage point difference in homeownership rates between the White population and minorities.

Researchers also calculated the minority median property value and the White median property value. For the purposes of this analysis, minorities are those who are not non-Hispanic White.
