## Activist and NAACP stalwart Fred Reed passes at 87

Fred L. Reed, Jr., a key figure in Milwaukee's civil rights movement who marched for fair housing and helped establish the first Black voter registration drive in Milwaukee, died recently. He was 87.

A memorial service will be held for Reed Saturday, April 12, starting at 10 a.m., at New Testament Church, 10201 W. Bradley Rd.

Reed became active in the local civil rights movement after being fired from Norberg Manufacturing—where he was a welder and union steward—because he participated in a fair housing march.

As an activist, Reed was able to learn from legendary Black political icons Lloyd Barber and Isaac Coggs. Reed became a member of the NAACP youth council.

The youth council—along with members of the NAACP Commandos—joined other community residents in marching for 200 consecutive nights in Milwaukee with the late Vel Phillips (then the first Black and woman alder in city history) and Father James Groppi, protesting housing discrimination and demanding fair housing, leading to the passage of the Federal Fair Housing Act of 1968.

Reed later transitioned to the corporate sector, becoming a supervisor at Boston Store. During this time he returned to school, graduating Magna Cum Laude from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee with a bachelor's of science degree in education.

He went on to work for the Wisconsin Department of Administration and the state's Department of Health and Social Services, where he played a key role in implementing the American Disabilities Act, and created the first complaint system for state inmates.

Reed also worked for the state Department of Financial Institutions as a senior financial examiner for over 25 years before retiring in 2011.

He remained active in the NAACP. He was the vice president of the Dane County NAACP and a trustee of the NAACP Lloyd Barbe Foundation and Trust. Reed served as vice president of the Black Data Processing Associates (BDPA), focusing on developing IT talent until 2025.

Under Reed's leadership, the Milwaukee BDPA chapter won the 'Comeback Chapter of the Year' award in 2016 for its growth and commitment to its members and students.

In 2024, Reed received distinguished recognition from the Wisconsin NAACP Conference of Branches, Wisconsin Gov. Evers, members of the Wisconsin Legislative Black Caucus, and the elected officials

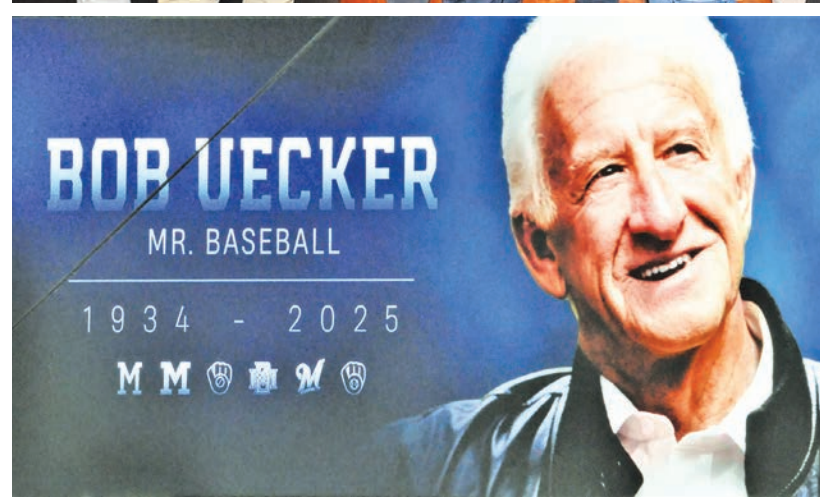

In February 2025, the Wisconsin state assembly enacted a resolution commemorating Black History Month for the first time in several years.

Reed, along with other distinguished figures, received acknowledgment from both the Wisconsin Legislative Black Caucus and the members of the state Assembly, who played a crucial role in facilitating the passage of the resolution.

Reed, who was born November 28 1937 in St. Louis Missouri, the oldest child born to Fred L. Reed Sr. and Mattie (Jackson) Reed.

He was raised in Kinloch, Missouri by his aunt and uncle after his mother died unexpectedly at the age of 24. Kinloch is a historic African American community that is home to notable figures like Cong. Maxine Waters, jazz saxophone legend John Coltrane, and actress Jennifer Lewis.

Reed excelled in sports and music during his youth and graduated from Kinloch High School. After relocating to Milwaukee to be with family, he attended welding school at MATC.

Reed is survived by his wife of 25 years, Andrea Reed; daughter Regina Reed, granddaughter Kayla, Grandson Kahri, Reed's brother, John, his sister Tracey Reed, and many other beloved relatives.

## Black Maternal Health Week

### State lawmakers take multi-state collective action on Black maternal health

*Resolutions and proclamations recognize Black Maternal Health Week and highlight the urgent need for state-based policy solutions to address the crisis*

WASHINGTON D.C.—State legislators from the State Innovation Exchange's Reproductive Freedom Leadership Council (SiX RFLC) will introduce proclamations and resolutions in recognition of Black Maternal Health Week (April 11-17) and call attention to the Black maternal and reproductive health crisis in the United States.

The resolutions and proclamations, in partnership with Black Mamas Matter Alliance, call for action to protect the health and well-being of Black women.

The introductions come as civil rights, Medicaid, abortion care, and medical research on Black maternal mortality outcomes are increasingly under attack by the Trump administration and state lawmakers aligned with Project 2025.

"In stark contrast to the attacks on vital programs and cuts to essential services coming from Washington D.C., state legislators are fighting for a future where Black women are treated with dignity, care, and respect," said Jennifer Driver, Senior Director of Reproductive Rights, State Innovation Exchange.

"In order to improve maternal health outcomes, we must address the systemic racism that impacts the lives of Black women before, during, and after pregnancy. From Michigan to Mississippi, our champion lawmakers

# Trump Profits, Black America Pays the Price!

As financial pain spreads across the nation, Black families are facing some of the harshest blows — while Donald Trump and his family throw parties, rake in cash, and dismantle protections built to ensure essential equity.

Over the weekend, while 401(k)s crumbled and mass layoffs loomed, Trump was the main attraction at two lavish, money-making events: a Saudi-backed LIV Golf tournament at his Trump Doral resort and a seven-figure fundraiser at Mar-a-Lago.

This all unfolded just days after Trump signed off on sweeping global tariffs — with a Sharpie now sold at his resort gift shop for \$3 — sparking one of the largest market crashes in U.S. history.

In just 48 hours, the S&P 500 lost \$5 trillion in value. By Monday, stocks were in free fall.

Analysts warned of inflation spikes that would hit everything from gas to groceries — and dis-

proportionately impact low- and middle-income households.

But for Trump, it was business booming. Every room, including the \$13,000-a-night suite, was sold out at Doral.

Guests shelled out up to \$1,400 for exclusive access, snapped up \$550 Trump purses and \$18 imported souvenirs, and dined on \$130 steaks while posing for photos with Trump family members.

“This is the perfect venue,” Eric Trump declared as his father bounced between luxury properties.

That same day, the former president posted from his golf club: “THIS IS A GREAT TIME TO GET RICH, RICHER THAN EVER BEFORE.”

For Black Americans — who already face the steepest hurdles in the economy — the timing is more than just offensive. It’s dangerous.

As the markets tank and federal agencies brace for disruption, Trump is also waging war on racial equity. He’s issued orders wiping out diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) efforts across the federal government. That includes dismantling Executive Order 11246 — a cornerstone civil rights protection that, since

1965, has barred discriminatory practices by federal contractors.

Roughly 18% of the federal workforce is Black. Many of those workers are now in limbo, with DEI staffers placed on forced leave and entire programs frozen.

Experts warn these rollbacks could erase decades of progress in hiring, retention, and advancement — not just in government, but in every sector that follows federal precedent.

Trump has also threatened clean air and water protections for historically neglected Black neighborhoods and proposed privatizing the U.S. Postal Service — one of the largest employers of African Americans. As working families watch their savings disappear, their job security vanishes, and their communities come under attack, Trump and his donors raise glasses over filet mignon and \$1 million checks.

The disparity isn’t just stark — it’s systemic. And it’s being monetized in real-time. From his Palm Beach resort, as the country buckles under the weight of his policies, Trump made his position clear:

“THIS IS A GREAT TIME TO GET RICH.”

As the Trump administration’s sweeping tariffs take effect, Mica Whitfield, Co-President and CEO of 9to5, National Association of Working Women, warns that the policies are another economic blow to already vulnerable communities—especially Black women.

“These tariffs are just a tax on working people, especially working women,” Whitfield said on BlackPressUSA.com’s Let It Be Known News show.

“They’re making decisions at the gas pump about groceries while rent is already sky-high. One in three single mothers is already living in poverty—tariffs push them closer to the edge.”

Whitfield, who leads 9to5’s mission for economic justice for working women and non-binary people of color, says these new economic burdens should be viewed through a gendered lens.

She compares them to the long-standing “pink tax”—the added cost women pay for everyday items like razors and personal care products—only much worse.

“We can think of it as the pink tariff,” she said. “Women already pay more with smaller financial margins. These tariffs just stack on top of that.”

In practical terms, the price hikes caused by tariffs reach deep into women’s lives, especially for those working in care industries or running small businesses.

From higher prices on diapers and cleaning supplies for childcare providers to increased costs for raw materials for Black-owned haircare brands, Whitfield said the domino effect is widespread.

“Black women are the fastest growing group of entrepreneurs, but they’re already struggling with access to capital,” she said.

“Now they’re forced to find new sources for packaging or ingredients just to stay afloat. This could close doors for so many of them.” She said the same goes for caregivers.

“We work with Black and Brown women who provide childcare in their homes or run small centers. Tariffs raise prices for the essentials they need—wipes, toys, and cleaning supplies—which are already expensive.

This is the kind of pressure that can bring the whole house down,” Whitfield asserted.

As Americans suffer from the fallout, states like California, under Governor Gavin Newsom, have floated the idea of independent trade negotiations.

However, Whitfield, who is based in Georgia, noted that such state-level innovation isn’t possible everywhere.

“Red states have been slow to respond to the administration,” she said. “Our folks in Georgia and Wisconsin are doing the resistance work on the ground, but it’s tough. We’re watching states like California try to hold the line while others leave working people to carry the burden.”

Whitfield says part of her organ-

chapters in Colorado, Wisconsin, and Georgia, organizing working women and non-binary people around issues like childcare, paid leave, workplace harassment, and economic justice.

Whitfield and her Co-President, Ashley Panelli, are the first Black women to lead the organization. “Our roots are in worker justice, but our focus now is specifically on those doing low-wage, care-based jobs—mostly Black and Brown women,” she said.

Though federal wins have grown more elusive, 9to5 continues to build power locally, pushing for change through city commissions, public service boards, and school boards.

“In Southwest Georgia, people were paying power bills as high as

ization’s work is to make economic issues like tariffs more accessible. “Tariffs sound abstract, but they’re not.

They’re a working people’s issue,” she said. “We’ve estimated they’ll cost the average family about \$3,800 a year—around \$300 a month. That’s a real hit.” She also worries about the Trump administration’s proposed cuts to programs like Head Start, which she said would devastate communities of color.

“These programs are already deeply underfunded. Millions of children who qualify don’t get access,” she said.

“Cutting Head Start means more kids without early education and more parents, mostly mothers—unable to work.

“It’s a domino effect that sets back another generation of Black and Brown children.”

Founded in Boston over 50 years ago, 9to5 inspired the classic film *Nine to Five*, starring Dolly Parton, Jane Fonda, and Lily Tomlin. Today, the organization operates

their rent,” Whitfield said. “So, we started organizing around public service commissioner races and utility boards—things people didn’t realize directly impact their lives.”

When asked how she got into this work, Whitfield traced her activism back to the Million Woman March in Philadelphia, which she attended as a preteen.

Her path continued through public health and maternal justice work before she joined 9to5.

“I worked with newly diagnosed women living with HIV, many who found out their status while pregnant,” she said.

“The intersection between economic stability and health became clear to me. From zip code to paycheck, it all impacts Black women’s well-being.”

Now, she’s calling on the public to see tariffs for what they are: taxes that hit the most vulnerable the hardest. “This isn’t abstract,” Whitfield said. “It’s going to impact your pockets.”

## ‘Target Fast’ Boycott Nears End as Black Shoppers Speak Out: ‘I’M DONE FOR GOOD!’

As the 40-day “Target Fast” draws to a close on Easter Sunday, thousands of Black Americans say the protest has sparked a permanent change in their spending habits—and in their view of corporate accountability. “I’ve been off of Target the last few weeks,” said Wayne Shepherd of Fort Greene, New York.

“Planning on making it a forever thing until I see real change. Same with Walmart, Amazon, etc.”

The boycott, organized by faith leaders including Atlanta-based Pastor Jamal Bryant, began March 5 and is meant to protest Target’s decision to scale back its diversity, equity, and inclusion (DEI) programs.

While framed as a spiritual fast during Lent, many participants say the economic stand has evolved into something much more significant.

“Haven’t stepped in a Target since their roll-back and don’t intend to,” said Hayden Towns of St. Louis, Missouri.

“Also avoiding Walmart, canceled all of my Amazon subscriptions, and weaning myself off of all Zuckerberg apps.”

Organizers launched the movement through TargetFast.org, encouraging Black consumers to redirect their dollars to Black-owned businesses and hold corporations accountable for

walking back racial equity commitments.

The site has tracked more than 150,000 participants. Since the boycott began, Target’s stock has dropped over \$13 billion in market value, and for the week of March 24, store foot traffic declined 3.8% year-over-year.

Bryant noted that Black America stands as the world’s 12th wealthiest nation in spending power. “We are strong consumers with astounding brand loyalty.

To see companies that we’ve supported heavily—like McDonald’s, Ford Motors, Amazon, Meta, and Walmart—betray our longstanding relationship is beyond disheartening,” Bryant declared.

“The greatest insult comes from Target, which pledged to spend over \$2 billion with Black-owned businesses by the end of 2025, only to find out that Target stopped the program at the start of the year,” he stated. Bryant said Black people spend over \$12 million a day at Target stores.

“Let’s just keep spreading awareness in case some folks haven’t got the message,” said Bernard Spain of Temple Hills, Maryland. “I live right near Walmart and still see too many Black folks in and out of there.”

# RICK JAMES WAS A CATALYST FOR MUSICAL TRANSFORMATION AND FUSION

Is it still Black History Month? Forget what you've been told; actually, it is.

Our history education lasts 366 days a year compared to a government-sanctioned 'Black History' Moment.'

That said, let me introduce a musical slant that came to me in the wee hours of the morning. A few days ago, I was unable to sleep and decided at 3:30 a.m. to watch a couple of documentaries on cable.

The first was irrelevant. The second kept me engrossed for two hours—the life and times of James Ambrose Johnson, Jr., aka Rick James.

Ambrose? No wonder he changed his name. Never met a Black—yellow or brown brother named Ambrose...but that's not the intent of his column.

Fusion was the one word that stuck in my mind while watching this documentary. Or, during the commercial breaks, musical transformation and experimentation.

While White America will not admit it, the descendants of the original African heartbeat drum beat not only influenced American music but defined generation after generation.

Whether it be jazz, rock n' roll, country (yes...COUNTRY MUSIC), or the blues, we touched it all.

We influenced all forms of American music, from classical to happy birthday versions—aka Stevie Wonder's version—we made an imprint.

What we didn't invent--musically--we influenced, put a new

slant or beat to it, and made it the most copied expression outside of slang, Ebonics, and colorized verbiage.

Rick James was a prime example. He started in Canada with a rock group and added a funk beat, operating under an assumed name since he was AWOL from the Navy.

When he returned to America, he infused R&B with rock and created a new genre, an early version of George Clinton's funk with a heavy rock impression.

His headlining protégé was Prince, who opened for him. He took the best of James's funkability and rock vibes and created his own stylings, one that carried a Minneapolis rock beat to it—heavy guitar rift solos.

Prince was also a musical genius who, along with James, introduced Black folks to a style that could not have survived in Memphis or Atlanta.

I once observed that Minnesota has the whitest Black people in the country, which made it a perfect platform for the Prince sound, which was an offshoot of James's rock/R&B/funk.

James could have done well in Minnesota. But his bland music wasn't well received at Motown Records until he fused it with an R&B underscore, with songs like 'Mary Jane,' which would have been censored had the production company figured out it was about a love for marijuana instead of a girlfriend.

Other songs were equally risqué, including 'the Ghetto,' which was given renewed life when used as a rap anthem.

(Incidentally, James was not a fan of the misogynic and anti-Black rhetoric of gangsta rap, even though he introduced a discourse on police brutality long before NWA.

But the point is that James was a catalyst for musical transformation and fusion. His early music served as a bridge between

two distinctly different genres of music (both with Afrocentric roots). He also proved to be an excellent R&B crooner in his later years, as evidenced by his duet with Teena Marie, 'Fire and Desire,' a top 10 hit, and Smokey Robinson, 'Ebony Eyes.'

The Chinese say you are lucky (blessed) to live in interesting times. I would add to that if you lived through interesting musical times.

From that perspective, I was truly blessed, growing up in the '60s and '70s, when I listened to Motown, Atlanta, and Chess productions.

From The Temptation to Isaac Hayes, James Brown, Delfonics, Stylistics, the Dells, and the Dramatics... the list goes on, but I'll stop there because there were too many great acts and I have too little time and space.

I was also blessed to grow up listening to the transformation from the 1950s do-wop, group rhythms of Motown—those love-making slow jams of the 1970s, and the Black power, socially conscience utterings of Marvin Gaye and Donny Hathaway.

In between were the poetic 'inspirational rap of the Young poets and the revolutionary utterings of Gil Scott Heron.

The Revolution would not be televised,' as we were too busy partying and hiding our heads in the concrete sand or following a political pied piper.

A Motown prodigy in the 1970s, James created a sound and style that kept the Motown Sound relevant.

And he produced more than funk/rock. He wrote and produced songs in the 1970s and early 1980s for the Temptations, Smokey Robinson, and Eddie Murphy.

He also proved that a white girl could sway and stay—i.e., Teena Marie, who was among my top 25 favorite soul singers.

We are the masters of music, connecting the dots between different beats and genres. Louis Armstrong opened the door for Motown and Atlanta.

White Americans were shocked to open their eyes to the smooth and transitional sounds of Nat King Cole and Sammy Davis, Jr., and were hooked on R&B when introduced to the assembly-line music of Barry Gordy and Motown.

Today, more rap records are purchased by White Americans than by Black folks.

In a nutshell, our music reshaped America, and it is about the only instrument stolen and shared.

Black music has transitioned from a simple drum beat to complex rhymes, spoken word, and rap. At each stage, our music has reflected our status and the reality of the times.

Thus, you listen to the music and realize it is a self-fulfilling prophecy. In fact, as I looked back at Rick James as a Black History maker and his role as a transitional musical emissary, I couldn't help but think of whether he reflected the music of the times or the times reflected who he was.

What isn't questionable is that he was a trend-setting, infused with rhythm originating from the African drum beat.

Rachel Strong in Los Angeles has cut ties completely. "A boycott should function like a strike; making it last a certain amount of time will hinder its effectiveness," she said.

"I've permanently cut off Target—switching to local grocery stores and buying fewer things in general.

"I think we as a people would benefit from consuming a little less." However, not everyone agrees on the long-term strategy.

"My question is, if Target is

really the second-largest employer of Black people in the country, isn't hurting them going to potentially hurt us?" asked Theresa Banks of Macon, Georgia.

"Doubly so, since the current admin is cutting fed jobs as much as possible."

Still, the pressure continues to mount. In addition to grassroots action, civil rights groups, including the NAACP and the National Newspaper Publishers Association, have launched their own public education and selective buying campaigns.

The NNPA represents the 198-year-old Black Press of America, which consists of more than 250 African-American-owned newspapers and media companies.

The Target Fast also includes demands such as restoring DEI initiatives, honoring a \$2 billion pledge to Black businesses, investing in HBCUs, and depositing \$250 million into Black-owned banks.

As Easter approaches, many say the movement is just getting started. "I'm not fasting," Wayne Shepherd said. "I'm finished."

## State lawmakers take multi-state collective action on Black maternal health

are putting forward solutions that improve the health and well-being of Black communities overall."

SIX RFLC lawmakers are championing policies, including protecting and expanding Medicaid, strengthening maternal mortality review boards, stopping anti-abortion lawmakers, and calling for sustained investment in Black communities.

"Empowering Black mothers is not just about improving health care. It's about affirming their right to thrive and ensuring equity in maternal care. I will continue to advocate for change and stand in solidarity this week and beyond," said Rep. Zakiya Summers (MS-68).

"Black women deserve to give birth without fear, to receive care without bias, and to live without the burden of systemic neglect," said Rep. Felicia Robinson (FL-104).

"Prioritizing Black maternal health isn't just necessary—it's right. Policies should protect, uplift, and ensure that our voices and lives are valued in every health care space."

The stakes have increased under the Trump administration. Federal research programs focused on decreasing Black maternal mortality rates have faced cuts and elimination. Meanwhile, the GOP-controlled Congress has threatened massive cuts to Medicaid and other services that will hit Black mothers and pregnant people especially hard.

"It is crucial to prioritize Black maternal health, especially given the recent drastic efforts to eliminate essential federal programs that support the health, nutrition, and financial stability of American citizens," said Sen. London Lamar (TN-33). "We must intensify our efforts to ensure that maternal health, particularly for Black mothers, is given the attention and support it urgently needs."

While maternal mortality overall has been declining, the rate for Black women has not improved. Black women are three times more likely to die from pregnancy-related causes than white women. 29% of Black women report mistreatment during maternity care, and medical care overall for Black women is rife with racist assumptions and practices.

"As a state legislator and as a mother, I am deeply committed to reversing the disturbing trends of Black maternal mortality and morbidity in our Commonwealth. Our vision must include bold legislative action like our Pennsylvania MOMNIBUS to make the lives of Black moms and birthing people matter," said Rep. La'Tasha D. Mayes (PA-24).

"In 2025, we are working to eliminate the Black maternal mortality crisis through initiatives that will expand doula services, target health deserts, and improve mental health access for all," said Rep. Gina Curry (PA-164). Curry and Mayes are the co-founders and co-chairs of the Pennsylvania Black Maternal Health Caucus.

# United Health Foundation announces \$7 million in grants to improve maternal and infant health outcomes
