'A Critical Path' SDC leaders discuss next steps to keep agency alive

Leaders of the Social Development Commission say continuing to get funding from the state as a community action agency is their priority for keeping the social services agency in business.

Being designated as a community action agency is important to SDC because it makes the agency eligible to receive federal block grant funds that support its anti-poverty programs.

The Wisconsin Department of Children and Families, or DCF, held a hearing on SDC's community action agency designation last Friday, nearly a year after SDC suddenly stopped services and laid off staff.

'A critical path'

"There's a critical path in order to continue to keep the funding coming into SDC, and in that critical path, the immediate first step now is to address the relationship with DCF," said Jorge Franco, SDC's interim CEO and the chair of the Board of Commissioners, this week.

Jeff Pertl, secretary of the Department of Children and Families, will make a final decision after reviewing all materials and after at least 90 days from the hearing, according to the department.

William Sulton, an attorney who represents SDC, said the agency is prepared to pursue legal avenues if the state moves forward with de-designation.

"SDC will still be around, it's just what form will they be? Will they be using 18th and North?" said Vincent Bobot, an

Earl Arms, a media and public relations strategist at Northwestern Mutual knew early on that he wanted a career in sports in some capacity.

Growing up in Milwaukee, the John Marshall High School graduate was always active in sports.

Arms grew up in single parent household, along with his sister, but his dad was active in his life.

He credits his extended

family and support system for giving him a well-rounded and loving upbringing, where education was always encouraged as a pathway to success.

Flint, Michigan and eventually at home in Milwaukee with Channel 58 (WDJT-TV), from 2013 to 2017. He later moved to Jackson, Mississippi to join WAPT as a News Anchor/Reporter.

When Arms transitioned from sports reporting to news, some people were surprised at that move.

"People put you in a box when you do sports reporting; they think that's all you are able to do. They try to limit you. A big part of my career transition from sports has been in ways that are intentional.

"I've proven to people that I'm more than a sports guy and have been able to go into different spaces and show that I'm more well-rounded than that.

"For example, I love Black history. I also know journalism in and out. I actively studied and didn't just watch sports.

"I've always been an avid reader, keeping up with the news, gaining an understanding how

society operates, and using those experiences to have success in all other areas of my professional career," said Arms.

These days, working in a corporate setting, Arms continues to pursue broadcast journalism

And, while he's experienced support and encouragement from numerous people, including his mother and older sister who he calls his 'greatest cheerleaders,' Arms has utmost admiration and respect for boxing legend Muhammad Ali.

"Ali used his platform as an athlete, to further the 'cause' and amplify Black issues. I admire that he was willing to put his livelihood on the line for something he believed in. That's incredibly inspiring. I still listen to the wisdom in

the things he said," Arms said.

While he has no children, these days Arms pays it forward by supporting and encouraging his nephew and young cousins.

"I was once in their shoes. Generations have changed and there's so much more 'noise,' opportunities and distractions out there, as opposed to when I was their age, but the premise

is the same.

"I tell them that if they are not sure how to navigate this complicated society, to remember that they have people in their lives who love them and want to see them succeed.

"I encourage them to listen to those who have been through the trials and tribulations of life, so they don't make the same mistakes," said Arms.

Arms said that the best advice he can give to today's youth is to listen, learn and be confident.

"Take time to listen, open your eyes and ears and take in everything that's happening. Immerse yourself in knowledge gleaned from books and older people who have wisdom.

"Once you've done that, believe in yourself, have confidence in your abilities and don't let anyone deter you from what is right," he said.

Arms said that he wants his legacy to be that he was someone who used his passion and gifts to make an impact on his family, society and the world.

SDC commissioner. "We'll build it from the bottom up if we have to."

Tapping into community

Walter Lanier, a community leader and pastor who was appointed to SDC's board a few months ago, explained why he thinks SDC is now in a better position to address the department's concerns after it already spent months meeting with DCF and working on improvement plan revisions.

"I think it's extremely significant that we have, in a short amount of time, doubled the size of the board, which reflects both individual commitments and institutional

commitments," Lanier said.

At full capacity, SDC's board includes 18 commissioners, a third of which are elected. The board's occupied seats dwindled to three in the fall after a series of resignations and terms expiring, but recent appointments have brought the board back up to eight commissioners.

Lanier wants to increase opportunities for the community to be involved in SDC's work and mission. He believes the board should hold elections for its vacant public seats in the near future.

Future plans

To pay owed workers and contractors, SDC is still pursuing reimbursements from

DCF for 2024 work as well as from other third parties.

"SDC has been sending out those payment requests and communications to receive

that money and SDC is also looking at other funding sources," Sulton said.

DCF rejected SDC's latest

reimbursement request in a letter last week, citing a need for more documentation to substantiate expenses and concerns about outstanding

payments.

To meet the department's requirements, SDC has retained a firm to conduct a sin-

gle audit, but Sulton said that process will take months and cost tens of thousands of dollars.

Franco said the department has the flexibility to grant reimbursements without a single audit, but an audit is listed as a requirement in DCF's block grant funding policies and procedures manual.

"My hope is that they're gaining the realization now of the difficult pathway they have ventured down now and that they will soon come to realize that SDC is the most immediate and efficient pathway to get services to the people who need them most: low-income persons in Milwaukee County," Franco said.

SD Properties Inc., the tax-exempt corporation that owns SDC's buildings, is also grappling with a \$2.98 million foreclosure lawsuit over its North Avenue properties from Forward Community Investments Inc.

Bobot, chair of the SD Properties board, said the board has 90 days to work with legal counsel to decide what to do but is strongly considering a deed in lieu of foreclosure.

"Then we'd make arrangements to have the bank take back the warehouse and the building on 18th and North if we cannot work out an agreement to keep it, but we bought some time," Bobot said.

Milwaukee County supervisors elevate community-centered values

Chairwoman Marcelia Nicholson, Supervisor Caroline Gomez-Tom, and Supervisor Juan Miguel Martinez issued the following statement in response to recent U.S. Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) arrests at the Milwaukee County Courthouse.

The supervisors are taking action by introducing a resolution of their own on Milwaukee's dedication to justice, safety, and access at the Milwaukee County Courthouse Complex.

"This resolution puts us on the right side of history and humanity. It's about protecting people. It's about protecting the process.

"And it's about protecting the promise of what our Courthouse is meant to be: a place of justice, access, and truth," said Chairwoman Marcelia Nicholson, the first African American Latina elected to lead the Milwaukee County Board of Supervisors.

"And by distributing Know Your Rights materials at the Courthouse Complex, we're giving residents tools not just to survive the system, but to understand it.

"That's how we empower communities. That's how we build a justice system worthy of the name."

"We are working hard and taking action to pro-

tect our community members," said Supervisor Caroline Gomez-Tom.

"The last thing we want is to turn people away from showing up for their court dates and seeking crucial resources here at the courthouse.

"We are introducing common-sense legislation that exemplifies Milwaukee's values—the right to due process and the presumption of innocence until proven guilty—and that serves all residents of Milwaukee County."

"We are working hard and taking action to protect our community members," said Supervisor Caroline Gomez-Tom.

"The last thing we want is to turn people away from showing up for their court dates and seeking crucial resources here at the courthouse.

"We are introducing common-sense legislation that exemplifies Milwaukee's values—the right to due process and the presumption of innocence until proven guilty—and that serves all residents of Milwaukee County."

The legislation requires the Office of the County Executive, the Presiding Judge of the First Judicial District, and the Milwaukee County Sheriff's Office to cooperate to ensure access to services for all and safeguard every person's constitutional right to due process.

The resolution would also advise Milwaukee County to support efforts to educate its residents about their rights and the appropriate steps to take during encounters with immigration authorities, while remaining steadfast in its opposition to ICE operating outside the law in and around the Milwaukee County Courts Complex.

The resolution was debated during the Justice, Law Enforcement, and General Services Committee meeting today, April 15. The resolution passed with four votes in favor, zero against, and one abstention.

Run for Something Hits Major Milestone: 200,000+ Aspiring Leaders Sign Up to Run for Office

New York, NY—recently, 'Run for Something' (RFS) announced that it has surpassed 200,000 sign-ups from people ready to run for office since launching in 2017 — a powerful signal that a new generation is stepping up to lead. This milestone cements RFS as the largest candidate pipeline of any political organization in the country, across the ideological spectrum.

"We launched Run for Something to lower the barriers for young people, women, LGBTQ+ individuals, and people of color entering the political arena," said Amanda Litman, Co-Founder and President of RFS. "Reaching 200,000 sign-ups isn't just a number—it's a symbol of the growing momentum of our movement. It's proof that our democracy is strongest when it's representative, and that more people than ever before are ready to step up and lead in their communities."

RFS was founded in 2017 on a clear premise: the gerontocracy needs to step aside and make space for a new generation of leadership.

Gen Z and millennial candidates aren't just the future—they're the now, and they're running for office because the people currently in charge, including many Democrats, are failing to meet the urgency of the moment.

Since the 2024 election, Run for Something has seen a surge

of interest in running for office. Nearly 40,000 people—20% of the total pipeline—have reached out just since Election Day. Major spikes came in after Trump's inauguration, Elon Musk's announcement cutting federal workers, and after Senate Minority Leader Chuck Schumer announced that he would support the GOP's spending bill. This surge underscores the clear energy and momentum to push back against the Trump administration and build power in state and local government.

From school boards to state legislatures, RFS alumni have gone on to win over 1,500 races across 49 states, reshaping the political landscape from the ground up.

As of now, 5 RFS alumni are now in Congress, and several others who will be positioning themselves to run for statewide office in 2026.

Run for Something (RFS) is a political organization that recruits and supports young progressive candidates for down-ballot office.

Since its founding, RFS has helped elect nearly 1,500 candidates across the country, including 18 candidates in red-to-blue seats in the 2024 election cycle.

Today, RFS has the largest database of any other Democratic organization, with nearly 40,000 people reaching out since November with interest in running for office.

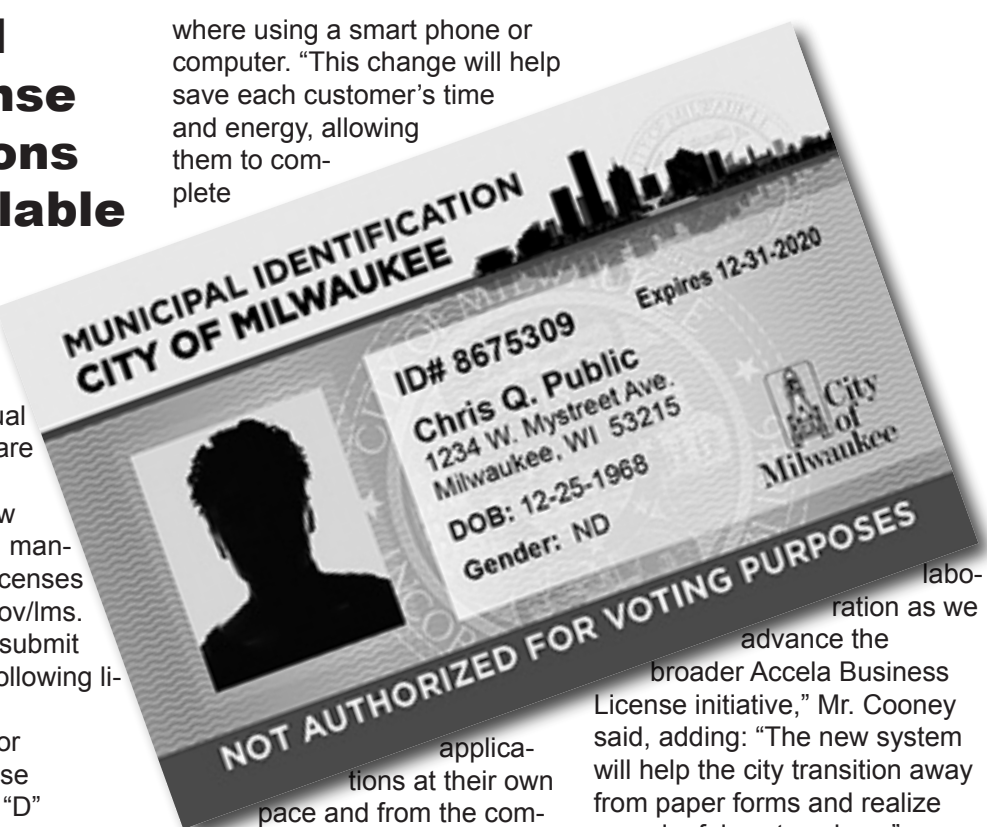

MomsRising has experts available to discuss our country's maternal health crisis during Black Maternal Health Week this week, including Tina Sherman, our National Director for Maternal Justice who is a North Carolina-based doula; and Monifa Bandle, our Senior Vice President, a maternal health expert whose Texas-based grandmother was once denied maternal health care because

of her race.

The United States is the most dangerous place to give birth in the developed world.

We are the only industrialized nation where maternal mortality has risen over the past two decades.

American women are more likely to die from pregnancy-related complications than women in the United Kingdom, Libya, and Kazakhstan — and Black women here are dying from pregnancy-related causes at 3 to 4 times the rate of white women. Most of these deaths are preventable.

Those numbers could get even

worse if Republicans in Congress slash the budget for Medicaid, which is a lifeline for moms and babies. Cuts to Medicaid would be disastrous.

Medicaid covers more than 40% of births in our country, including half of births in rural communities.

It provides vital prenatal and postpartum care and accounts for 75% of public family planning dollars.

Put simply, cutting this vital program would endanger moms, babies, and families — especially in Black, Brown, and low-income communities that already face significant health disparities.

IT'S THAT 'DANG' WORD AGAIN!

California radio station's use of 'the n-word' stirs-up another chapter in the ongoing struggle to END (once and for all) use of this offensive racist epithet!

A Los Angeles radio station is being taken to task for posting the n-word (nigger) on its X account.

Station management explained away the one-word 'post' as a 'technical error.' What is even more preposterous is the ignored double standard the controversy generated.

The controversy is second only to the hypocrisy over the double standard regarding the use within our community of 'negritudes,' our (your) use of the word, whether as an assault or term of endearment. Within that context is our (your) assertion of ownership and rejection of use by anyone other than tribal members.

Black folks will assault, verbally and physically, non-tribal members who utter the word. People have died when the word has been used. Bigots use it as an epithet before lynching. And whites have been killed for using the word within Black circles.

On Saturday, members of the National Black Journalists Association-Milwaukee Chapter (NABJ) discussed a Monday meeting the national body scheduled with the KTLA radio station management, which posted the term.

If I handled public relations for the station, I would throw fresh corn in the pig pen and infer the person who penned the word was Black!

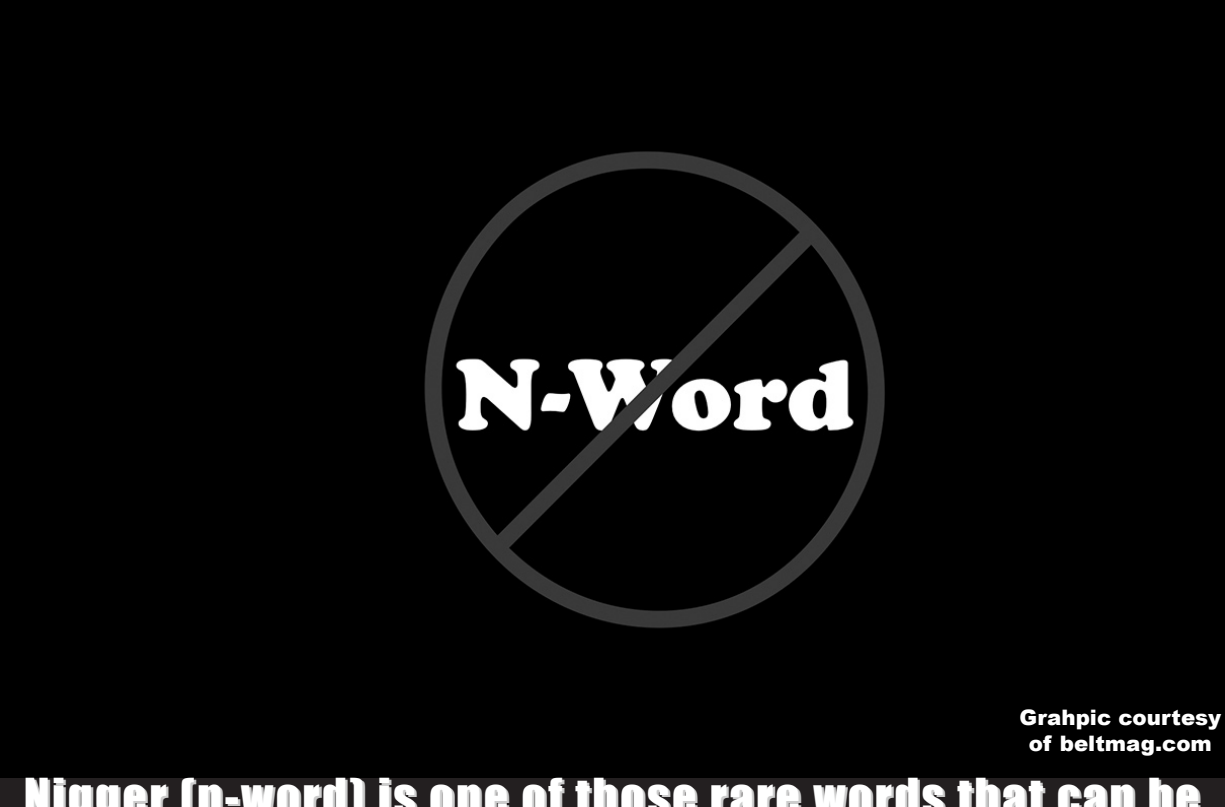
What would the civil rights and professional Black organizations say to that circumstance? And therein lies the root of hypocrisy, since the same folks who condemn white (and I assume yellow and brown) use of the word generally can be found using the word themselves.

In fact, I've heard nigger (n-word) used on local Black radio. I heard it used on 107 'The Truth,' and WNOV 860 AM.

Should not the NABJ confront them? Or does this professional organization, one of the most powerful in the country, allow this double standard?

Hmm, think I'll ask or merely send them this column.

I cringe when I hear Black celebrities, politicians,

and...yes...even preachers using the racist epithet...err, term of brotherhood. In fact, I'm waiting for a Black minister to refer to the Lord Jesus as 'My Nigger' (n-word) during the upcoming Easter celebration.

I'm not being blasphemous. I'm just intentionally bringing this hypocrisy to the forefront.

Most of (y'all) use the racist epithet as a term of affection or brotherhood. Many upper-class Negroes attach it to low life, 'Neckbones,' and criminals.

Nigger (n-word) is one of those rare words that can be an adjective, noun, or verb, depending on its use. It is both a racist epithet and a term of endearment. For me, however, it is the former. It was created by bigots and implies lazy, trifling, non-

human beings (meaning us).

Their most excellent ploy was to convince us that we were, in fact, this lazy subhuman. If you follow the 'Willie Lynch paradigm,' the task of the slave owners was to convince us that we were despicable savages, i.e., niggers (n-word).

Black users ('victims') of the term today thought we could defuse the word by taking ownership of it.

We somehow converted the word to a 'positive' connotation when used by us, but linked to a racist if used by anyone else outside of our race.

White folks are thus told they can't even recite the lyrics of gangsta rap songs they purchase. A biracial brother can't use it. A white mother can't tell her Black child (a drop of Black blood) he's 'my little

cute nigger.' White folks can't refer to each other as niggers (n-word) if used in a dictionary sense.

Former president Barack Obama can't nod in recognition of a Black journalist who referred to him as 'my nigger' (n-word) as he did in a nationally televised speech.

From my vantage point, that reeks of hypocrisy. Can Whites even read materials that contain the word out loud in a classroom setting? Apparently, they can't.

Across the county, government schools (including Shorewood High School here) are banning books like 'Huckleberry Finn' and 'To Kill a Mockingbird' because they include nigger (n-word), even though that was the language of that era.

If it was rewritten with 'the n-word' inserted as a substitute epitaph, would that be acceptable, if not ridiculous?

We can't change history. I recently watched an episode of the television series, 'In the Heat of the Night' (based on the movie of the same title that starred the late great Sidney Poitier). It bleeped out several 'nigger' (n-word) references.

However, the word was used when the television show was airing in the 1980s. The original movie I referenced in the previous paragraph was set in the 1960s and took place in racist Mississippi (as does the television version, which is set during the period it aired).

Bleeping out the word commonly used by racists diminished the essence of the scenes. If a KKK member said he didn't want a 'bleep' Black cop on his property, that was within character. He was speaking about his intent. Mississippi is a racist state. You knew it by what they said.

In the town square was a statue of a Confederate soldier—a racist hero. I say keep it up. And fly the Confederate flag above him. Let us know. Leave no doubt.

I don't know what the NABJ hoped to accomplish with their Monday meeting. And what if a brother used the word. It's a double standard we can't justify.

I say erase 'nigger' from our vocabulary. Nobody should use the word. Or let's agree Jesus was a nigger (n-word). Post that!—Hotep.

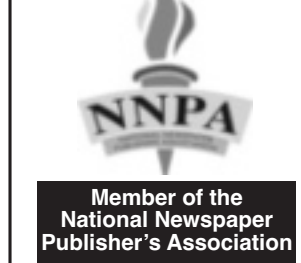
