## JEFFREY NORMAN reappointed MKE POLICE CHIEF!

The Milwaukee Fire and Police Commission (FPC) recently reappointed Milwaukee Police Chief Jeffrey B. Norman to a second term as the city's top cop!

During his first full tenure (he was appointed acting chief of the department in 2020 and later appointed to a four year term in 2021) Norman demonstrated exceptional leadership abilities and a firm understanding of what it takes for the MPD to be effective and responsive to those it serves.

He has worked to implement new and innovative ways to prevent, disrupt, and deter crime within the city. At the same time, Norman has emphasized a collaborative approach to improving public safety.

To that end, Norman prioritized strengthening the department's partnerships with community organizations and residents with the goal of building a shared vision of public safety in Milwaukee.

A lifelong Milwaukee resident, Norman joined the department as an officer in 1996 and steadily rose through the department's ranks.

In a press statement, the FPC said it remains committed to providing Norman with the support he needs to lead the department. "We look forward to continuing to work collaboratively with him to increase both safety and justice in the city of Milwaukee."

Four Milwaukee police officers have been shot in the line of duty since 2018.

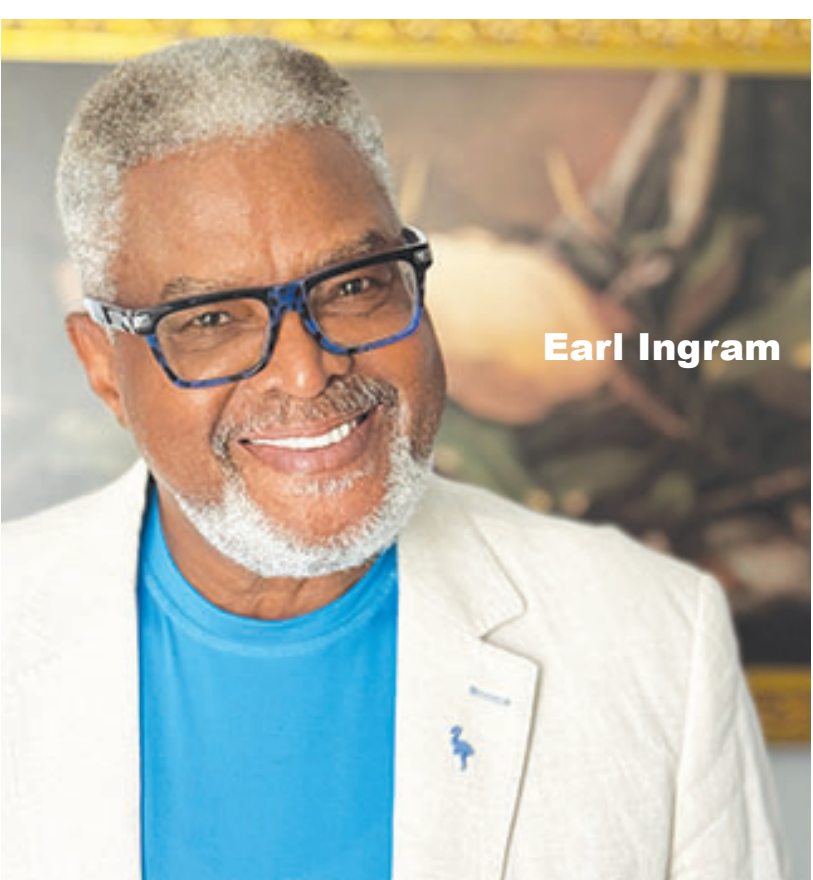
To be sure, any murder of an innocent African American pains me. The death of a public servant infuriates me even more.

Earl Ingram's upbringing in Milwaukee is replete with nostalgia of which many baby boomers can relate. One of 13 children, his parents were married for 66 years. His father worked at American Motors and A. O. Smith, and his mother was a stay-at-home mom before it became a buzzword.

"I admire my father. He raised 13 children and we were never hungry or homeless. Any man who went to work every day and bought 13 pairs of shoes before he could get one pair for himself has to be the person that most influenced who I am," said Ingram.

After graduating from high school at the age of 18, Ingram started working at

A. O. Smith. He walked out of the building for the last time at the age of 54. He's been married to

his wife, Allie, who he met at the age of 14, for 44 years. They have two sons, Jason and Julius.

"I grew up in a segregated community, attending a segregated school. By the time I was in sev-

ican dream," Ingram said with a laugh.

Ingram is matter of fact about the cultural shock he encountered, along with racism.

"In this new, mostly white com-

munity, I saw and experienced racism and bigotry for the first time. It wasn't pretty but it made me stronger. I have no regrets. Those experiences helped prepare me for what the world is really like. Had I not gone through that experience, I wouldn't be the man that I am today," he said.

Listening to the radio was Ingram's favorite past time. He bought his first transistor radio at the age of 12 and he can still recite O.C. White, Jim Frazier, Dr. Bop's bravado or rap.

"Those conversations shaped who I am. I also enjoyed listening to Eldridge Cleaver, Dr. Martin Luther King, and Muhammad Ali. All those Black men fighting for me and people like me shaped my warrior instinct. They fought against injustices and live with

me daily," said Ingram. He didn't just listen to Black radio hosts, but also conservative talk show hosts like Mark Belling and Charlie Sykes, challenging them on their call-in shows.

"I built a following among Black and White people, which eventually led to me becoming a fill-in radio host for Eric Von's radio show on WMCS," said Ingram.

He earned a name for himself in radio, which opened the door to him having his own talk show. Over the years he has interviewed such notables as Dick Gregory, Michelle Obama, Oprah Winfrey, Maya Angelou and President Joe Biden, just to name a few. He has also been a fill-in for top rated Black syndicated radio host Warren Ballentine.

Besides radio, Ingram's other passion is serving others. More than 20 years ago, he and his wife decided to take in a disabled young boy who was born with half a brain. Now 23 years old, they remain his full-time caregivers.

"Taking on this responsibility changed our lives forever. And while we changed the trajectory of this young man's life, he's done some things to make our lives better," said Ingram.

Ingram admitted that one of his greatest challenges in life was that nobody ever told him that he could be somebody—not even his parents, who

were busy raising 13 children, or any of his teachers. "When I began to realize that I could be somebody I was 50 years old. One of the reasons I spent 35 years at A.O. Smith was that the money was good. I was never arrested and I was always a servant, but I didn't think that could manifest into anything," he said.

That changed when Ingram organized the Neighborhood Children's Sports League, serving as its president for more than 20 years. During this time he helped build the largest youth tackle football league in Wisconsin. It started out at McGovern Park but grew so large—800 kids strong—that they moved to Lincoln Park.

After retiring from the Sports League, Ingram wanted to rest, but it would not be so.

"God kept talking to me and I told Him to leave me alone. I ran the league, took in a disabled child, volunteered 12 years for Milwaukee Public Schools and I thought it was time for me to rest.

"Growing up, we had Big Mamas and Paw Paw's. They are not there anymore. The younger generation does not want to hear anything the elders have to say. All over the world, people sit at the feet of the elders, but not our community.

"I founded the Voices of the Elders to remedy this. We mentor children and created an eight-point blueprint to help guide these boys through life.

That eventually led to my involvement with Camp Rise, which was jointly created by Mayor Cavalier Johnson, Employ Milwaukee and myself to help prepare boys, 10-13 years old, for the world.

"We met at North Division High School and taught them work ethic and other social skills. Each boy received \$40 a day, five days a week and, at the end of the summer, those 200 boys earned \$1,400 each," he said.

And while he's done a lot with his life, Ingram said that in the end he just wants to be remembered as somebody who loved humanity.

"We must realize that we have a responsibility as Black men to uplift, give back, transform, direct, and guide young boys. After we're gone, somebody has to lead. The legacy of our people must continue," he said.

# Harvard Report, State of the Nation's Housing 2025:

## Black homeownership gains have halted since 2023; only 1 in 7 renters can afford to buy a home

For the first time in 30 years, rising home prices and interest rates have translated into a drop in existing home sales and worsening affordability challenges for middle class families.

Among the nation's 46 million renter households, only one in seven - 6 million - in 2024 earned at least \$126,700, the amount needed to afford a \$2,570 monthly payment on a \$412,500 median-priced home. And these escalating costs likely contributed to the 771,480 people who were unhoused in 2024.

For Black Americans, the homeownership gains that occurred between 2019 and 2023 have halted.

Last year, the white-Black homeownership gap remained stuck at 27.7 percentage points, and the same measure for Latino families was 25.2 percentage points.

These are among the findings in The State of the Nation's Housing 2025, an annual report published by Harvard's Joint Center for Housing Studies (JCHS).

Regarded by researchers and housing stakeholders as one of the most comprehensive assessments of the entire housing market, its findings share year-to-year changes and trends in construction, housing for owners and renters, as well as the effects of policy changes and proposals on the market.

Beyond its substantive findings, this year's report is also a call to action.

"There must be a concerted effort to do more to address the affordability and supply crises," says, Chris Herbert, Managing Director of the Center.

"The potential consequences of inaction are simply too harmful to the macroeconomy and the millions of households striving for a safe,

affordable place to call home."

As of early 2025, home prices are up 60 percent nationwide since 2019 and are increasing 3.9 percent year over year.

This year, a median-priced new home comes with a price tag of \$459,826. Additionally, last year marked the fewest home sales on record since 1995.

"This is a shocking five times the median household income," says Daniel McCue, a Senior Research Associate at the Center.

"This is also significantly above the price-to-income ratio of 3 that has traditionally been considered affordable."

Two key factors affecting the costs of homeownership -home insurance and taxes - continue to rise. Home insurance premiums jumped 57 percent from 2019 to 2024, according to Freddie Mac.

Locales with the most severe weather-related disasters were hardest hit.

Tornadoes, floodings, wildfires, and hurricanes impose financial tolls on renters and homeowners alike.

For example, in Miami where weather-related disasters frequently occur, the cost of home insurance for a median-priced home is \$920 per month, or more than \$11,000 per year.

"The scale and frequency of climate disasters has prompted private insurers not only to raise premiums, but in some cases to reduce coverage or pull out of markets entirely, as in California, Florida, and Louisiana", states the report.

Rising property taxes add yet another affordability challenge.

In states considered 'low tax,' average annual property tax costs can be as low as \$1,100, as in Alabama, or as high as \$10,100 in New Jersey, generally considered a 'high tax' state.

Nationwide, the average 12 percent increase in 2021 and 2023 led to an annual \$4,380 tax bill. While tax abatement programs have been implemented by some state and local govern-

# The History Of Birthright Citizenship And Its Connection To Slavery

### With the Supreme Court's latest decision involving birthright citizenship, its important to know its history.

At first glance, birthright citizenship and slavery may appear to be separate issues, but their histories are deeply intertwined, grounded in the same constitutional principles, and shaped by the same racial and economic forces that eventually allowed African Americans and many other people of color to gain U.S. citizenship.

With President Trump threatening to undo this legal right through his latest executive order, the history of birthright

citizenship could be dramatically altered, changing it as we know it today. On Jan. 20, his first day in office, Trump signed an executive order seeking to alter the constitutional principle that grants automatic citizenship to anyone "born or naturalized in the United States."

Through this order, Trump

Citizenship would also be denied if the mother was in the U.S. legally, but only temporarily (like on a tourist, student, or work visa), and the father was not a U.S. citizen or legal permanent resident at the time of the birth. In both scenarios, the child would not automatically be granted U.S. citizenship, even though they were born in the country. In response to the executive order, a group of Democratic-led states have

filed a federal lawsuit against President Trump's action.

Opponents believe that the order violates the 14th Amendment, which has historically guaranteed citizenship to anyone born in the U.S., a legislation that has long ties with slavery.

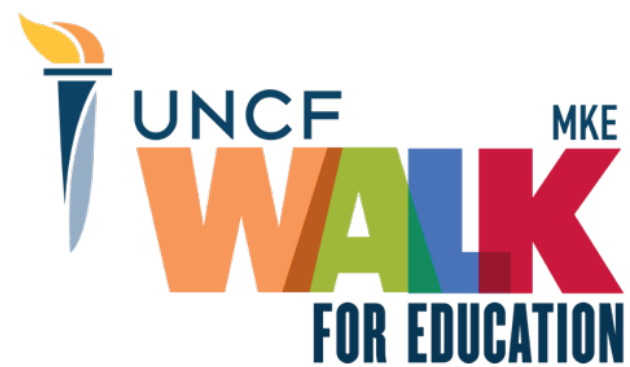

The Milwaukee County Historical Society is currently producing a television documentary about the history of Milwaukee’s Black community. It will start with the arrival of Joe Oliver, who settled here in 1835 to work as a cook for fur trader Solomon Juneau, and continue through the ‘Black Lives Matter’ movement of today. The project is led by John Gurda, a writer and historian who has been studying his hometown since 1972, working with Black historians Clayborn Benson III, Reginald Jackson, and Dr. Robert Smith of Marquette University. The documentary will rely heavily on historical photographs from local archives, including the Wisconsin Black Historical Society and Museum, but community input is being actively sought. In order to give the film an authentic grassroots flavor, the producers are looking for both still photos and especially home movies that depict every life in the Black community in decades past. The subjects will include backyard barbecues, house parties, birthday celebrations, musical performances, amateur sporting events, graduations, weddings, anniversaries, and anything else that shows what daily life was like in the past. Movies made before 1990 are of particular interest and a modest honorarium will be paid for images actually used in the documentary. Bronzeville Week, an official City of Milwaukee event, is an annual experience that honors the residents of our beloved community, reimagines what is possible and pays tribute to an area of historic significance for Milwaukee’s African American community – all through the celebration of commerce, art and culture.

The jury found him guilty of violating the Mann Act concerning transportation for prostitution with regard to Cassie and Jane Doe, two of the five charges against him.

After nearly two months of gut-wrenching testimony and legal theatrics, the fate of Sean “Diddy” Combs now rests in the hands of a 12-member jury.

On Monday, the federal jury, comprised of eight men and four women, began deliberating Combs’ criminal sex-trafficking case, but ended the day without reaching a verdict. Less than an hour into deliberations, the panel raised red flags in a note to Judge Arun Subramanian, stating,

“We have a juror, number 25, who we are concerned cannot follow your honor’s instructions.”

Subramanian, acknowledging their concern, instructed the jury to continue deliberations and reminded them of their legal duty to consider the facts without bias.

Later in the day, two more notes were sent to the judge, one containing a question regarding the drug distribution allegations tied to Combs’ alleged coercion tactics.

Subramanian indicated he would answer that question on Tuesday morning. By 5 p.m. ET, the jury had officially adjourned after roughly five hours of discussion. Deliberations resumed Tuesday at 9 a.m.

Combs is charged with two counts of sex trafficking, two counts of transportation to engage in prostitution, and one count of racketeering.

The charges stem from what prosecutors describe as a decades-long pattern of abuse, intimidation, and coercion, anchored by Combs’ influence in the entertainment world.

Federal authorities claim Combs turned his “multi-faceted business empire” into a “criminal enterprise” in which he and his associates engaged in kidnapping, arson, physical violence, sex trafficking, and forced labor, among other al-

leged crimes. During closing arguments, Assistant U.S. Attorney Christy Slavik concluded her remarks by thanking the jury and summarizing the evidence presented over the past several weeks. “He thought that his fame, wealth, and power put him above the law. But over the course of this trial, his crimes have been exposed,” Slavik said. “Up until today, the defendant was able to get away with these crimes because of his money, his power, his influence.

That stops now. It’s time to hold him accountable.”

The government’s case, bolstered by graphic testimony from

over 30 witnesses, painted a disturbing picture of Combs as the kingpin of “freak offs,” drug-fueled, dayslong sexual performances involving manipulated women.

Federal authorities claim they have video evidence and witness testimony corroborating the abuse, which allegedly included weapons, kidnapping, and even arson to silence victims.

Combs’ legal team, however, pushed back hard. Lead defense attorney Marc Agnifilo didn’t attempt to sanitize his client’s past but instead argued that the prosecution exaggerated the scope of his wrongdoing. Agnifilo said the defense made no attempt to dispute allegations that Combs battered then girlfriend Cassie Ventura.

“We own the domestic violence — I hope you guys know that,” he said as he began his closing.

Despite acknowledging the

physical abuse, Agnifilo described the relationship between Combs and Ventura as “a great modern love story.”

Agnifilo continued his closing arguments, portraying his client as a deeply flawed man who led a swinger’s lifestyle, had a drug problem, and sometimes physically assaulted his girlfriends.

But he argued the government’s accusation that Mr. Combs was a sex trafficker or the ringleader of a racketeering organization was “badly exaggerated.”

“He did what he did,” Agnifilo admitted. “But he’s going to fight to the death to defend himself from what he didn’t do.”

Despite the weight of the accu-

sations, Combs did not take the stand, and his team rested its defense in under 30 minutes, calling no witnesses and seemingly betting the burden of proof would fall short.

Judge Subramanian reminded jurors on the first day of deliberations the importance of tensioning unbiased in the decision, “You are to perform the duty of finding the facts without bias or prejudice as to any party,” underscoring that his rulings throughout the trial are not to be interpreted as guidance on the defendant’s guilt or innocence.

Combs has remained in custody at Brooklyn’s Metropolitan Detention Center since his arrest in September 2024 after multiple requests for bail were denied.

The music mogul once known for being the juggernaut of hits and high-profile parties is now facing the possibility of a lifetime behind bars.

## The history of the 14th Amendment and Birthright Citizenship

The connection between birthright citizenship and slavery becomes most apparent through the 14th Amendment to the U.S. Constitution, ratified in 1868.

This amendment was a direct response to the Civil War and the abolition of slavery, encapsulating the promise of equality and citizenship for all people born on U.S. soil.

The 14th Amendment's Citizenship Clause states: *"All persons born or naturalized in the United States, and subject to the jurisdiction thereof, are citizens of the United States and of the state wherein they reside."*

Before this amendment, the legal status of people born in the United States was often a source of contention.

Prior to the Civil War, enslaved people, even those born in America, were considered

property, not citizens. The Dred Scott v. Sandford decision in 1857 denied citizenship to Black Americans, ruling that they could not claim rights under the Constitution, Archive notes.

This was a blatant reminder of how slavery and the denial of citizenship were intertwined. The 14th Amendment sought to correct this injustice by guaranteeing citizenship to anyone born on American soil, regardless of race or former

status as an enslaved individual. The amendment also extended the protections of the Bill of Rights to the states and gave the federal government the power to penalize states that denied citizens the right to vote by reducing their representation in Congress proportionally.

The landmark change was part of the broader Reconstruction efforts to rebuild the nation after the Civil War and integrate formerly enslaved

people into the fabric of American society as full citizens.

## Slavery, Race, and the Citizenship Clause

The abolition of slavery, officially established by the 13th Amendment in 1865, marked a significant shift in U.S. law, but it didn't immediately ensure true freedom or equality for Black Americans.

Although former slaves were legally free, they continued to face systemic racial discrimination, disenfranchisement,

and segregation.

After the end of Reconstruction in 1877, Southern states swiftly passed Jim Crow laws that aimed to strip Black Americans of their rights, even those born in the U.S., according to the National Museum of African American History.

Despite these setbacks, the 14th Amendment played a vital role in advancing their rights, providing legal protection, and reinforcing the promise of equality under the law.

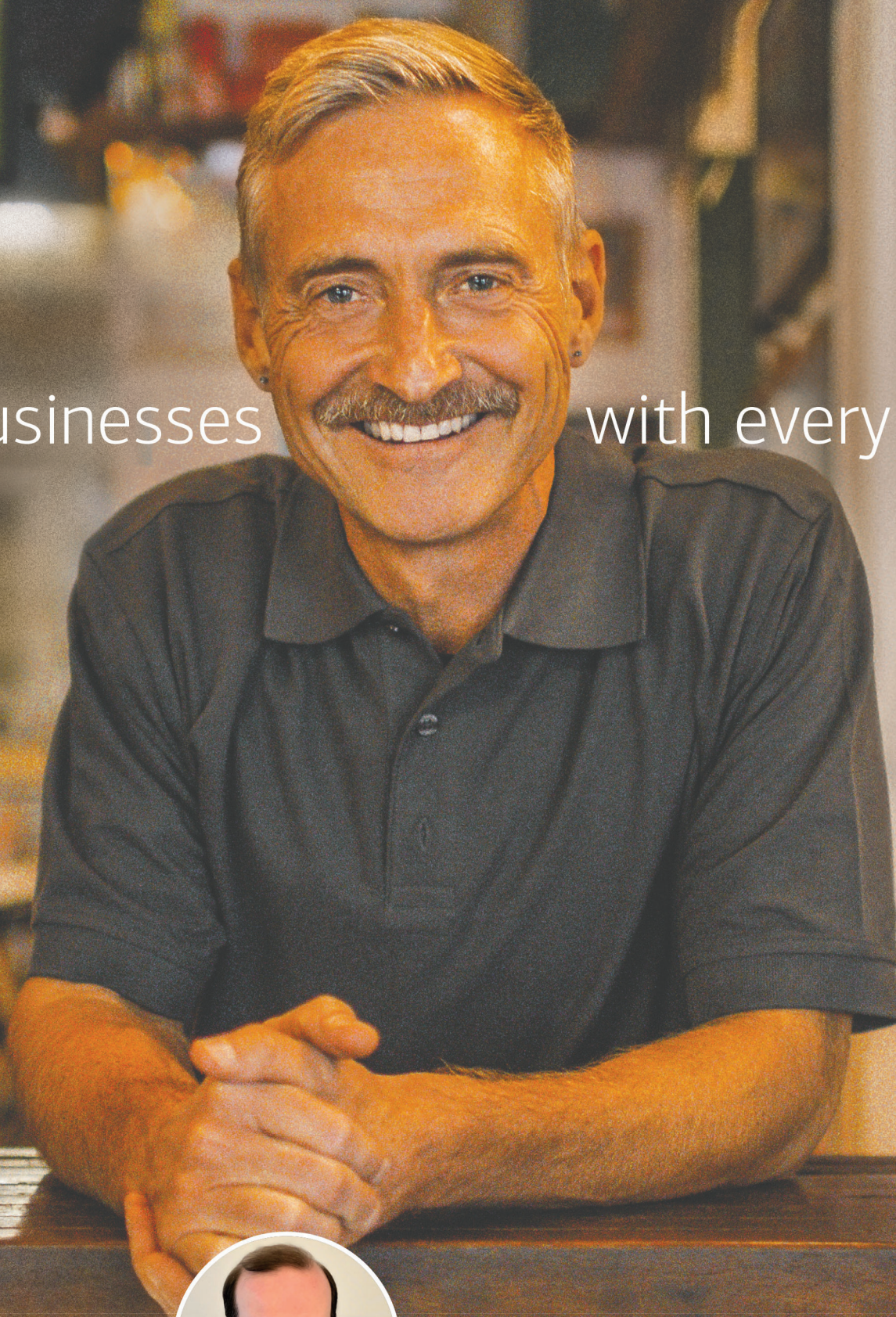
