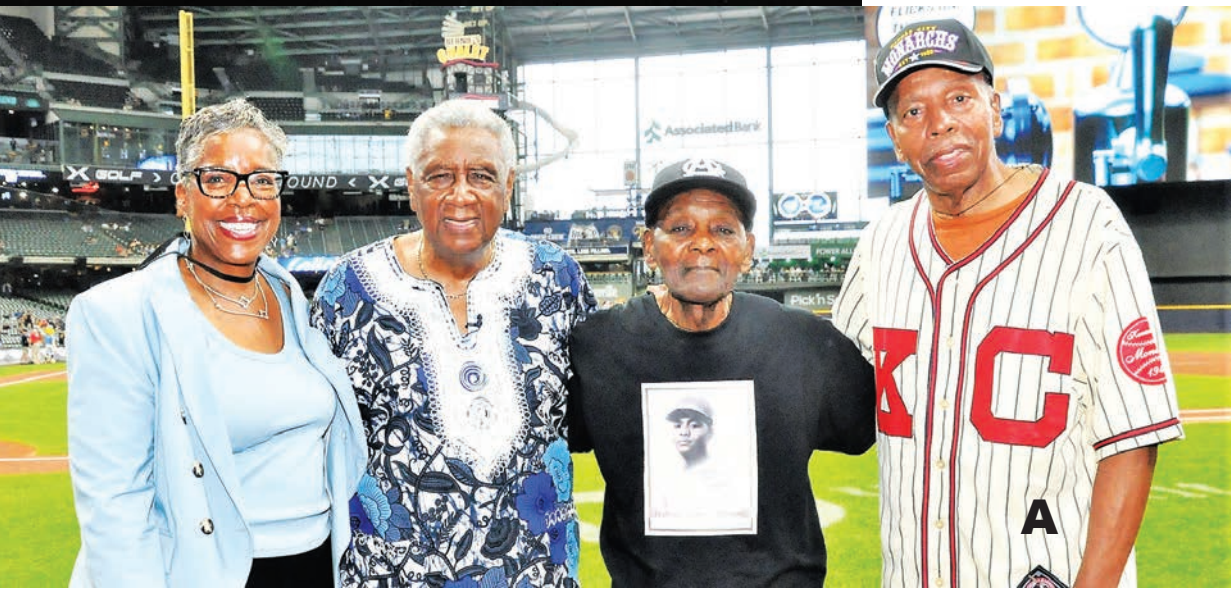

## Gov. Evers blasts Trump Administration over blocking \$72M for Wisconsin's kids and schools

Gov. Tony Evers recently blasted President Donald Trump and the Trump Administration over efforts to withhold more than \$6 billion for K-12 school districts across the country, including over \$72 million for Wisconsin's kids and schools that the state was expecting to receive.

These critical funds support the state's K-12 kids and schools and technical colleges through after-school and summer programs, English-learning programs, educator trainings, and more.

The governor's lawsuit comes as the U.S. Supreme Court yesterday issued a devastating decision to allow the Trump Administration to resume disastrous mass firings at the U.S. Department of Education—a move toward ultimately dismantling the agency—adding continued stress on Wisconsin kids, schools, and other facets of the state's and country's educational system that rely on federal support.

Earlier this month, Gov. Evers announced Wisconsin was joining a multi-state lawsuit challenging the Trump Administration attempting to cut funding already approved by Congress to help support critical mental health services in Wisconsin's K-12 schools and higher education institutions, jeopardizing millions of dollars for Wisconsin kids' mental health over the next several years.

"President Trump and the Trump Administration's war on kids and schools continues, Evers said in his statement regarding the new lawsuit.

"From the get-go, this administration has done virtually nothing to help support Wisconsin's kids or our schools, instead attacking Head Start Programs, trying to dismantle the Department of Education, and attempting to gut millions of dollars to help support our kids' mental health," the governor continued.

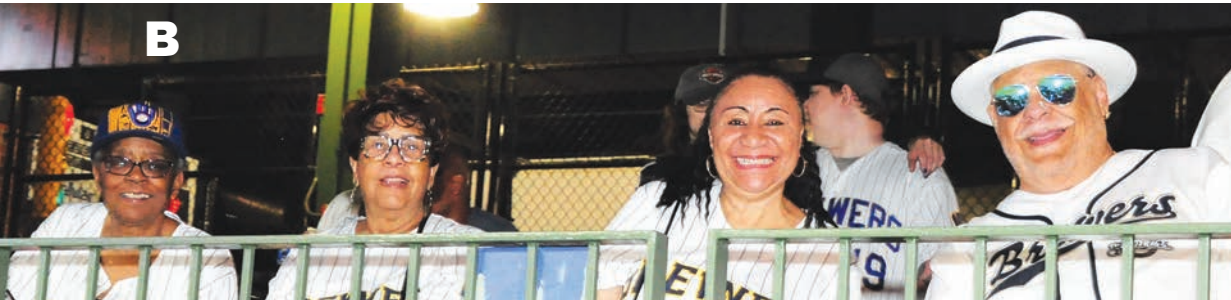
"America's kids and schools depend on these critical resources and services. These reckless decisions are deeply concerning to me as a governor who's also a former educator—but they also alarm me as someone who's the grandparent of nine grandkids. President Trump and the Trump Administration must stop messing with our kids. Period.

"I promised I'd fight every effort by President Trump and his administration to mess with our schools, our kids, and their futures, and I will continue to keep that promise."

# Richard Badger Using His Voice to Affect Change

An unfortunate incident involving racial profiling changed the trajectory of Richard Badger's life.

Now the Director of Workforce Initiatives with Wisconsin Community Services, Badger vividly recalls the police stop on Elm Grove Road.

"I was driving my father-in-law's car, on my way to close on a home I had just purchased when a police officer pulled me over and wrote me a ticket for no other reason than I had looked at her.

"This was during the time that Congressman John Conyers (deceased) had introduced racial profiling legislation.

Then-Senator Russ Feingold

letter on the Senate floor to push the bill through.

"Long story, short, that's what locked me into understanding the power of legisla-

tion and the power of our voice, and helped push through what is now law," said Badger.

An avid fan of the television show "Quincy, MD," prior to this incident, Badger had



had introduced the bill at the Senate level.

"I wrote him a letter about my encounter because it made me angry. His office called and asked if they could use the

dreams of becoming a coroner. He had even entered the Army as a combat medic, but as fate would have it, the police stop forever changed the course of his life.

"All in one day, my parents got divorced, my father retired from the military, and my sister and I were sent from California to Milwaukee for summer vacation. So, technically, I'm still on summer vacation," said Badger.

At the time, Badger was

seven years old. He and his older sister, Terri, spent their summers in California with their dad every year after that, but Milwaukee became their permanent residence because it's where his mother was from.

These days, Badger continues to spend time pushing people to make sure their voices are heard.

In fact, one area of his life that was truly impacted, led him to become intimately involved with the Milwaukee Fatherhood Initiative (MFI).

"I became Terrence Ray's case study. At the time, he was

Director of MFI. We were inseparable. A large part of some of MFI's original efforts were built around what I was going through when I was prevented from seeing my children.

"I learned that there is value in consistency. I did everything I could do to maintain who I am and who my parents raised me to be, but there were times that Terrence had to 'talk me off the ledge.'

"Anger can fuel you, but he taught me the impact of not accepting NO. He should have given up on me, but he didn't. I appreciate him as a mentor.

"When I talk to other fathers, I tell them to stay true to who

they are. You can only control your behavior, not that behavior.

"Your children will judge you based on what they see. Now that my children are grown, they appreciate how I handled the situation," he said.

Still yearning to help change policy, Badger made an unsuccessful run for the State Assembly in 2008.

"I continue to do the work that needs to be done, even though I didn't get elected. It's difficult to get people to see the full picture and not look at politics as a popularity contest.

"It was disappointing to see how people voted against their own interest to support someone who has shown no support of the community.

"What needs to be done still needs to be, so I continue to do that work," said Badger.

There's a more 'playful' side

to Badger's life these days, as he is deeply involved with an organization that promotes black golfers. Called We Black, We Golf, the platform was founded for Black golfers by Marshall Martin (DJ Mr. Martin). Tony Reese spearheaded a similar group in Milwaukee.

"I got thrust in the middle of it because I play golf and speak golf. It's exciting to see our community gravitate to golf. During covid, it became a way to socialize in a safer manner.

"Golf is more than a sport, it's a skill. The group has grown and evolved to attend various community events such as festivals like Juneteenth Day.

"We encourage and expose others to golf. With more than 12k members, we now travel to other cities. People won't go to a golf course by themselves,

but out in the community they do enjoy it and become more inclined to go to the golf course," said Badger.

One of Badger's goals is to honor and live up to his family's legacy.

"As a kid, I never fully appreciated my name. I was named after both my grandfathers. My maternal grandfather was Rev. Martin Childs, Sr.

"At his funeral, so many people spoke so highly of him, but I never fully appreciated it until I was older. I was 12 or 13 when he passed from cancer.

"It was amazing to see all the people who attended his funeral to show their reverence for him. Since I carry his name, I try to make sure I do right in life because of him and his legacy," he said.

Badger is also open about his own battle with prostate

cancer. "In 2016, at the age of 43, I was diagnosed with cancer. One of the most consistent things I do now is ask men about their health. As Black men, we don't talk or initiate that conversation about our health and the importance of getting annual physicals.

"That's how my cancer was detected. So many cancers can be treated or eliminated if they are detected early," said Badger.

One bit of advice Badger gives to other men is that information is power.

"Share any information you have once you have it. Once you have that power, you can empower others," he said.

In the end, Badger said that he hopes people will know that he loves his family and his community, and that he tried to improve both.

## City takes a step forward in providing more housing with the 'Housing Element Plan'

Milwaukee is experiencing a growing need for more housing, particularly affordable housing, due to rising rents, increasing populations, and a limited housing supply. This shortage is impacting residents across income levels and is a key concern for the city's future.

It's towards that end that the City took a massive step forward recently in its quest to diversify and maximize housing options in the city. The Common Council will adopt the 'Housing Element Plan,' which is Milwaukee's new blueprint for quality, affordable housing citywide, as well as legislation to immediately move forward with the possibility of Accessory Dwelling Units (ADUs) across the city.

ADU's are secondary housing units on a single-family residential lot, providing independent living spaces with amenities like kitchens and bathrooms.

They can be detached, attached to the main house or created within the existing structure (e.g., garage conversion). ADUs are also known by various names like 'granny flats,' 'in-law suites,' or 'backyard cottages.'

"We continue to hear from our residents that housing needs to be addressed in a meaningful way," according to a joint statement by several members of the Council.

"Through the Housing Element, the city will seek to strategically tackle housing affordability, promote a variety of housing options, combat displacement, and remove barriers within the zoning code."

Council members also noted the plan also seeks to incorporate housing needs with other city goals such as growing the city's population, job creation, and a variety of other priorities. This plan also works in unison with additional legislation passed recently to allow ADUs.

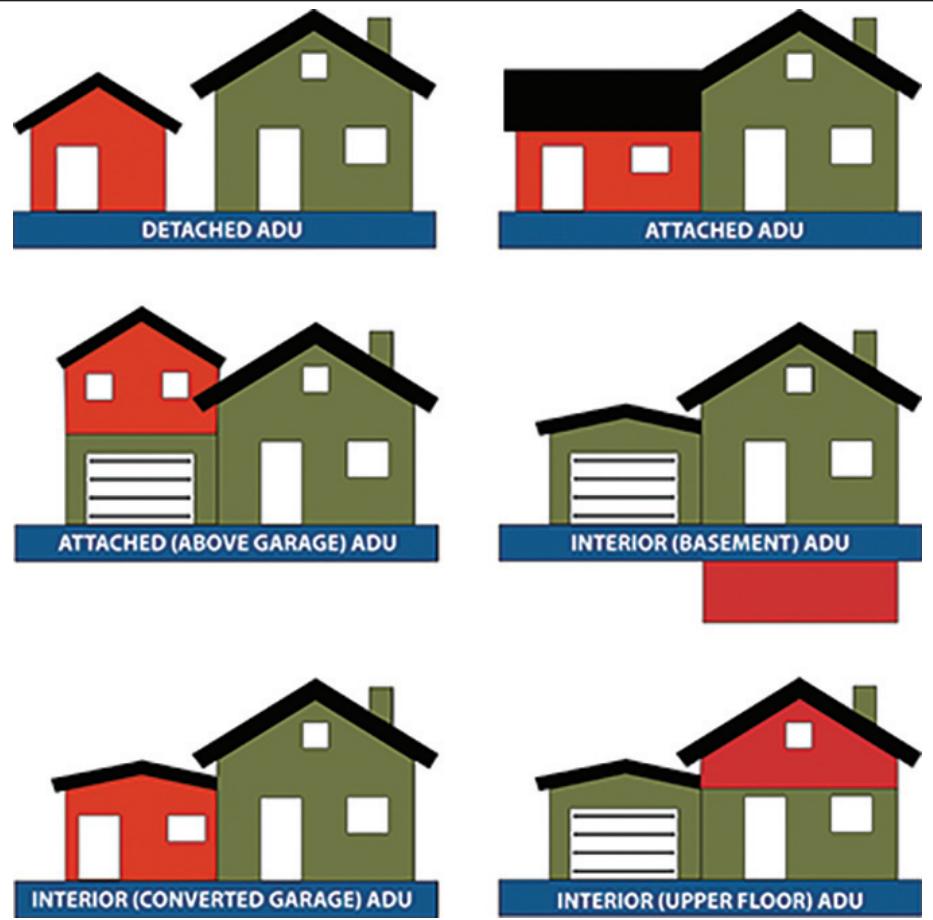
"We must also acknowledge the process by which we arrived at this point. The creation of this plan was not without hiccups, but it was through community engagement, collaboration, and dedication by all parties involved we have landed in this spot," read the statement.

"Processes such as this are much stronger when the community provides thoughtful input, and we thank everyone for sharing their thoughts along the way. We also want to thank the Department of City Development for their years of hard work creating and amending this plan.

While today's success is notable, it is only the start. The real work begins now to use these tools and implement the strategies outlined in the Housing Element. We look forward to continuing this effort and sharing additional news as we progress.

While these are significant steps that change the status quo, the challenge is so deep that it warrants greater investment. "As we are set to receive the proposed 2026 city budget soon, we seek an increased, long-term stable funding source for the successful down payment assistance program and the Housing Trust Fund. These tools combined can address historic and systemic challenges from the past and rebuild our city for the future - a city where all of us can thrive.

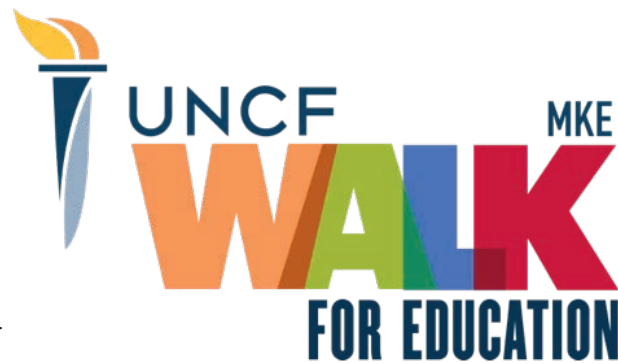

**The celebration of life for 'Mz. Rose' Marie Lue-Hing**

Saturday, July 19, at St. Martin de Porres Catholic Church, 3114 N. 2nd St. Visitation—1p..m.

A powerful presence, a vibrant spirit, and an unwavering voice for justice, Rose Marie Lue-Hing, lovingly known as 'Mz. Rose,' was a force of nature whose impact rippled far beyond the borders of Milwaukee.

Born in Milwaukee on August 30, 1938 to Reverend Elijah Manning and Fannie Equilla Soward Reed, Rose Marie Soward Reed was rooted in faith, purpose, and service from the very beginning.

Her deep Catholic faith shaped her values and her voice — a voice heard in her work place, across radio airwaves, city council chambers, and community forums as she championed truth, equality, and justice for all, especially Black women and the underserved.

Her stand for social justice, community advocacy and civic engagement will forever be in the history books of Milwaukee.

A devoted mother to her beloved son, Michael Douglass Lue-Hing (who preceded her in death on August 31, 2016), and a proud grandmother to Carrington Marie Lue-Hing, Mz. Rose often beamed about Carrington's talent as a professional dancer — a gift she claimed was passed down from her own days of dancing with joy and grace.

Mz. Rose wore many hats: She was a trailblazing Contract Analyst at WE Energies, where she made history as the first Black woman in that role. As a Union Steward with International Brotherhood of Electrical Workers Local 2150 (IBEW 2150), she fought for pay equity and justice in the workplace, changing policies and breaking barriers.

Upon retiring, she continued her pursuit of excellence by earning her associate's degree in business and bachelor's in Social Work from MATC — living proof that dreams have no ex-

piration date. She was an activist, historian, and actress captivating audiences with her dynamic and colorful view of life, her advocacy, and her lived wisdom. A long-time parishioner at St. Martin de Porres Catholic Church, she sang in the chorus for 8 a.m. Mass, and brewed the best coffee around — a Sunday staple.

She was also active with The Knights of Peter Claver and Ladies Auxiliary, the NAACP, West Indies Association, Ebony Ice Ski Club, countless other organizations throughout the years and also helped found Harambee Community School which blossomed into the Harambee Neighborhood Community.

Never one to sit on the sidelines, Mz.

dance floor, and every life lived boldly, without apology.

She leaves to cherish her memory, her granddaughter, Carrington Marie Lue-Hing; Tamara

She was light on her feet at Caribbean dances, held her own at Jamaican domino tables at the Caribbean Inn, and was a fixture at community staples like Mr. Perkins Restaurant, Sam's Place, Catfish Lounge, The Social Club, and the Atkinson Library, her second home.

Mz. Rose never met a stranger. Her warmth, her wit, her long silver locs, and her no-nonsense wisdom made her unforgettable. She loved her people fiercely and gave her all to make Milwaukee — and the world — a better place.

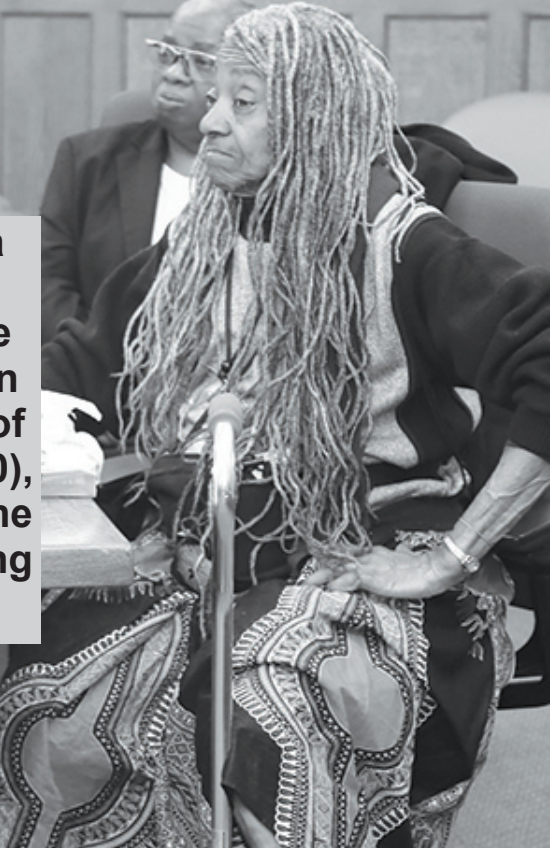
From advocating for retirees' rights at her former job to calling governmental officials to task, she showed up, spoke out, and stood firm. ## Our Black Press, Our Communities, Our Collective Survival

Let it first be said that this commentary is not intended as a criticism of any person or organization, but a gentler reminder of who we are, what we are confronting and how we survive.

First we must remember that we have been telling our own story for 198 years. That means through slavery, Jim Crow lynchings, segregation and every human horror you can think of, we have been successful because we have worked together, the Black Press and our communities. The big difference today is not the President, his MAGA efforts, anti-DEI (just another term for anti equality, anti Affirmative Action, etc), but our efforts to attempt to deal with the issues as individuals and organizations. Simply stated, we have a generation that has grown up on Social Media instead of remembering the Black Press is still our "Trusted Messenger." Some of the blame rests on our papers, many of whom are struggling to keep up and survive in a rapidly changing time.

The attack on our people, organizations and institutions is just as real as the raids on immigrants. The attack is on the funding of programs and services that so many of us have come to rely upon. Along with that has come a corporate reduction in ad revenue for our newspapers.

Over the past 198 years, when we didn't have ads, we had the support, often financial, of our people and our communities. Our communities supported our papers with their personal interest and support of what we did as well as their few dollars.

Today, we the collective African American population have more income than ever before and often fail to see the importance of maintaining the Black Press as one of the two most important institutions in our lives, the second one being the Black Church, which is another story.

This week the National Urban League is meeting in Cleveland, Ohio and the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People (NAACP) is meeting in Charlotte, North Carolina. The National Urban League President, Marc Morial, is on board with the importance of the Black Press. He addressed the topic at the recent annual meeting of the National Newspaper Publishers Association (NNPA).

It is important that all our organizations restore the Black Press as a key partner in this battle for survival that we all are engaged in. The Black Press publishes the press releases and events of our organizations, but do we encourage those corporations and businesses that we give our hard earned dollars to, to advertise their products and services in our media outlets when they spend billions of dollars each year on mainstream media and now social networks, but give nothing back? Case in point, this week as our two oldest and largest Civil Rights organizations meet in the cities named above, have they encouraged their corporate sponsors to advertise their meetings in the local Black newspapers and media outlets since we are both print and digital? Why are we still talking about getting business with Target when too many of us are still giving our dollars to Target as well as Marshall's, which is owned by Target?

African Americans spend approximately 4 trillion dollars a year, which is larger than some world economies. Why are we still meeting and holding panel discussions on problems we already know how to address? Solution: Remember that corporate America and business only respect three things: (1) loss profits, (2) bad publicity and (3) votes cast against their interest. We have the ability to influence all three without calling for a "boycott" or "fast".

Instead of rhetoric, we should be demanding that a "paid" presence in our newspapers becomes the first indicator of appreciation and value for our business. But we can never demand that others respect us more than we respect ourselves.

Our Churches, fraternities and sororities, businesses and nonprofits that our papers report on week after week providing a tangible record of their events and activities, must return to both financially support our paper and insisting that those we spend money with do the same.

After you read this, please find at least 5 people who you know would not read this without your making it available to them and discussing it with them. Remember, our survival depends on God and us, not those who appear to be in control.

## Trump's Drug Pricing Order Could Cost Cancer Patients the Cures They Need

As longtime patient advocates who have guided thousands of cancer patients through treatment decisions, clinical trials and insurance battles, we've witnessed the life-changing power of medical innovation and the devastating consequences when treatments arrive too late.

Today, we're sounding the alarm about a policy that threatens the future of that innovation.

President Trump's recent executive order calling for a "Most Favored Nation" (MFN) pricing model for prescription drugs may appear, on its surface, to address affordability concerns. In reality, it risks undermining the system that delivers breakthrough treatments to Americans with cancer and other life-threatening conditions.

An MFN approach would peg U.S. drug prices to those paid in other developed countries, effectively mandating that Americans pay no more than the lowest price offered abroad.

This might sound like a common-sense reform. Yet, it ignores a critical reality. Many of the countries that would be used as price benchmarks under MFN keep costs down by delaying -- or denying -- access to therapies through government pricing boards.

In the United Kingdom, France, Canada and many other countries, patients routinely wait months -- or even years -- longer than Americans for breakthrough treatments. In cases where manufacturers are unable to offer their products at the government-mandated prices, patients can't access the therapies at all.

For patients with rare cancers, genetic disorders and treatment-resistant conditions, the stakes couldn't be higher. These communities rely on continued research into therapies that may benefit relatively small populations but deliver transformative outcomes. With drug development timelines stretching over a decade and overall success rates around 10 percent for compounds entering clinical trials -- and often lower for oncology candidates -- the opportunity for a sound return on investment risk isn't a luxury; it's essential to sustaining the innovation pipeline.

We share concerns about affordability. Many of the patients we support struggle daily with the cost of care. If the goal is to make medicines more affordable for patients, the focus should be on reforms such as ensuring negotiated discounts are passed through to patients at the point of sale and fixing insurance structures that place the greatest burden on the sickest individuals.

Importing foreign price controls through MFN would be a retreat from a proven model that's consistently delivered the world's most advanced treatments to Americans before anyone else.

As patient advocates, we've seen too many families lose loved ones while waiting for scientific breakthroughs. The recent MFN executive order might deliver a short-term political win, but implementing it would be a devastating long-term loss for patients whose best hope lies in continued medical innovation. Because American patients get these drugs first, they'll be affected soonest, but patients worldwide rely on U.S. drug innovation. MFN might end up standing for Medicines For No-one.

We can and must pursue affordability and access without sacrificing the scientific progress that improves and saves lives.
