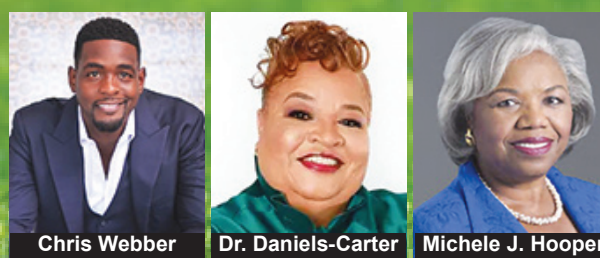

Malcolm-Jamal Warner, Beloved Star of "The Cosby Show," Dies at 54

WASHINGTON — Malcolm-Jamal Warner, the actor best known for his role as Theo Huxtable on the groundbreaking NBC sitcom *The Cosby Show*, has died at the age of 54.

Warner reportedly drowned while on a family vacation in Costa Rica, according to a family source cited by *People* magazine. His death was confirmed on Sunday, July 21.

Warner's sudden passing has stunned fans and colleagues alike. He is survived by his wife and daughter, whose identities have been kept private throughout his career.

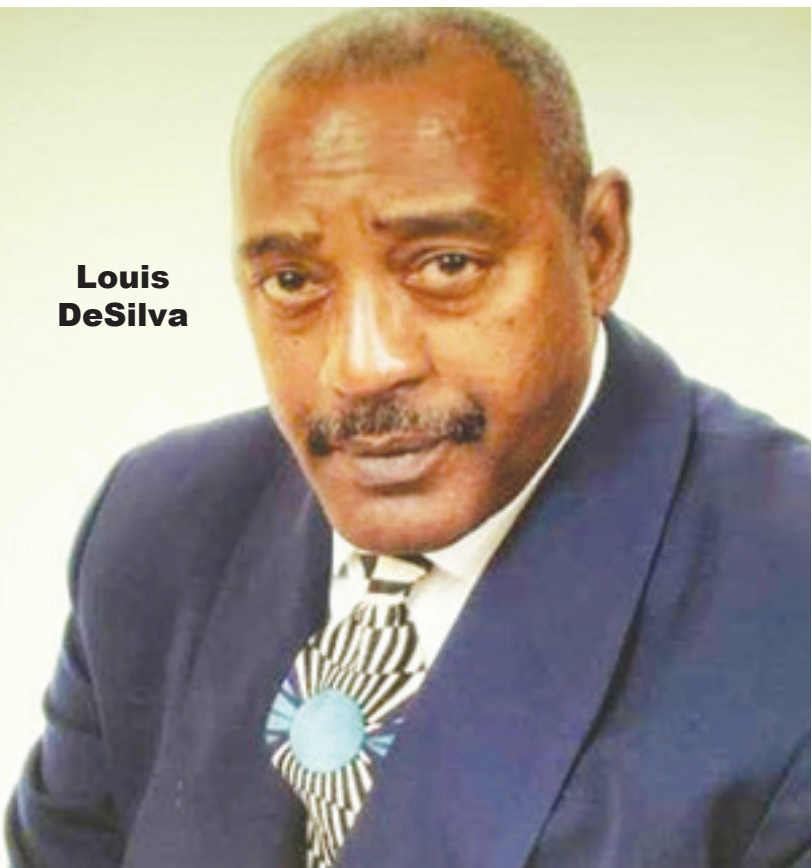
Authorities in Costa Rica have not released additional details, but Warner's death is being described as a tragic accident.

Warner became a household name in the 1980s as the wisecracking middle child of Cliff and Clair Huxtable on *The Cosby Show*, one of the most successful and influential sitcoms in television history. His portrayal of Theo earned him an Emmy nomination and endeared him to millions of viewers during the show's eight-season run from 1984 to 1992.

After *The Cosby Show*, Warner continued to build a diverse and acclaimed career. He starred in the UPN sitcom *Malcolm & Eddie* from 1996 to 2000, and held recurring roles in numerous TV dramas and comedies, including *Major Crimes*, *Suits*, *Community*, *The Resident*, *Reed Between the Lines*, *Jeremiah*, and

Honoring the life and legacy of Mz. Rose — A Milwaukee Treasure

This past Saturday, family, friends, dignitaries, and community members gathered at St. Martin de Porres Catholic Church to honor the remarkable life and legacy of Ms. Rose Marie Lue-Hing — affectionately known as 'Mz. Rose.' The atmosphere was filled with reverence, remembrance, and radiant joy — exactly the way she wanted it.

A traditional Catholic Mass was held in her honor, followed by a jubilant Celebration of Life Repast, where laughter echoed, tears were shared, and stories of her powerful presence came alive. His message couldn't be timelier in the wake of an unprecedented dismantling of our public health care systems.

As faith leaders, we are dedicated to keeping Wisconsin kids safe, healthy and tobacco-free.

We support efforts to help adults break free of tobacco addiction. As clergy we see and hear from community members who suffer from losing loved ones to tobacco and their concerns about how youth are targeted by the tobacco industry.

Through our community partnerships, and CDC and FDA funding to our state, progress has been made in reducing youth access to tobacco products and reducing the adult rate of smoking and raising awareness about issues such as tobacco industry targeting.

The evidence demonstrates how our efforts have resulted in significant successes.

The rate at which tobacco and vape retailers sold to underage consumers in Wisconsin dropped from 13.6% in 2023 to 11.8% in 2024.

The latest data shows that the adult smoking rate in Wisconsin dropped from 24% in 2000 to 12% in 2023,

Breakfast Club M.K.E. Serves Up More than Food

On the second Friday of every month, you can find as many as 90 Black men—young and old—gathering at Family Table Restaurant on Brown Deer Road.

While partaking of a variety of breakfast foods, they fellowship, uplift and learn from each other.

They also have an ulterior motive: they want to groom younger men to become leaders, fathers, stewards of the community, and heirs of the Breakfast Club M.K.E.

Louis DeSilva, one of the five founders of Breakfast Club M.K.E. and the moderator, said the group started as a way for a handful of longtime friends to stay connected.

Shortly after starting, COVID-19 halted the gatherings. Now, post-COVID, the group has taken

on a life of its own.

In addition to laughter, reminiscing, and providing a safe space for men to listen and be heard, the Breakfast Club M.K.E. has become a gathering to groom



and grow younger men. At the same time, since the founders are 'seasoned' seniors, Breakfast Club M.K.E. participants are hoping to lay the foundation to ensure the group continues long after

they are gone.

"This started as a men's fellowship—a way to connect with other men—and grew from there. At first we had about 25 men gathering regularly. That grew to

50, then 70 and now close to 100 men show up.

"As young boys, we grew up on Franklin Square and the Boys' Club. People like Roy Hill, Jimmy Johnson, Andrew Doug-

las, and others 'schooled us' on the playground. They taught us how to be gentlemen and men.

"Those guys and others like them are one of the main things that our youth are missing in our city. I hope the Breakfast Club M.K.E. will pick up some of that slack.

"We want young men to meet and interact with men who have lived full lives and raised their families.

"We want to pour into the younger generation and help them build a solid foundation to become men of tomorrow," said DeSilva.

Born and educated in Milwaukee, after graduating Rufus King High School, DeSilva attended the University of WI-Oshkosh and helped establish the Alpha Phi Alpha Fraternity there.

Along the way, one of DeSilva's best friends pushed him into a role he never envisioned taking on; he became the State Director of Alpha Phi Alpha, ran for and was elected to the national Board of directors.

A group of Oshkosh frat brothers, including DeSilva, recently met in Oshkosh to celebrate one of their own, Dorian Boyland. Boyland, who played in major league baseball for a time, enjoyed a prestigious and profitable career in the automotive industry.

The University of WI-Oshkosh recently renamed its Multicultural Education Center the Dr. Boyland University Hall.

Breakfast Club M.K.E. is a family and community affair. It's not unusual to see Mayor Cavalier Johnson, Common Council President Jose Perez, former Lt. Governor Mandela Barnes, retired Judge Russell Stamper, Police Chief Jeffrey Norman, Senator Tammy Baldwin, Lamar Franklin (Garfield's 502), Rev. Greg Lewis (Souls of the Polls), and a host of other community leaders attend these breakfasts.

They share information, observations, make announcements,

and enjoy lively fellowship and camaraderie.

"The older men often invite younger men to accompany them to the breakfast. We also have speakers come in to share information, inspire us, or promote a call to action. Each time we meet, we invite special guests," said DeSilva.

Women sometimes attend Breakfast Club M.K.E. as well. DeSilva said there are about 12 women that regularly attend the fellowship.

While the group has been informal, they are in the process of establishing Breakfast Club M.K.E. as a nonprofit organization and hope to secure their own building. Their private Facebook page boasts more than 500 members.

"We're establishing the group as a 501(c)(3) because there are some things we want to do in terms of fundraising. We're also getting ready to launch our website.

"From there, we'll probably go to a membership fee platform and have chat rooms," said DeSilva.

While about 300 of the men live in Milwaukee, others live all over but stay connected to the group.

For his part, DeSilva has lived

in Seattle, Los Angeles where he worked for United Airlines; Atlanta, GA, where he worked for MCI Communications, and Cincinnati, where he spent time working for Proctor & Gamble. He also lived in Orlando, FL for a time.

"We have a large following. Some men who have moved from the city even schedule their visits back to Milwaukee so they can attend our breakfast.

"After a little problem with my heart, my daughter asked me to come back home to Milwaukee because she didn't think I was taking care of myself," he said with a laugh.

Apparently the Breakfast Club M.K.E. is 'good medicine,' because DeSilva and his cohorts are thriving in an environment that promotes laughter, fellowship, and information sharing.

DeSilva recalls advice from his dad, "never tell anyone what you are going to do. Like NIKE, just do it!"

And that's exactly what DeSilva and the Breakfast Club M.K.E. are doing—quietly building a 'no judgement' space for Black men to fellowship, discover or renew friendships, while they listen, learn and grow.

Open House Celebration of New Notes for Notes Studio at Running Rebels East

Runnings Rebels is proud to announce the official opening of the new Notes for Notes (N4N) music recording and production studio at their East location.

They will host an open house on July 23rd from 1-3pm featuring tours and a chance to see the studio in action. The studio is sponsored by Keith Mardak and Mary Vandenberg, both longtime supporters of Notes for Notes and Runnings Rebels, and is the fourth location that Keith and Mary have sponsored in the Milwaukee area since 2022.

N4N is a non-profit organization that builds, equips and staffs recording studios outfitted with industry-grade equipment and gear. Youth have the opportunity to explore, create and record

music for free under the guidance of a talented N4N Producer. CEO and Co-Founder of N4N, Phil Gilley,

says the program is intended to fill gaps in musical programming at public schools while enriching young people's lives through the transformative bonds that form with their peers, producers and the music community.

"We are thrilled to launch our fourth studio in Milwaukee and first in collaboration with Running Rebels," said Gilley. "This is a very special partnership for us and we designed the studio to be extremely versatile to accommodate dynamic sessions where RR team can really utilize the space to connect with youth."

One of the largest N4N studios yet, it features Mix A and Mix B rooms

each with their own tracks rooms, an iso room set up for live band tracking and a large foyer that doubles as a podcast lounge. It's equipped with all the major DAWs, guitars, drums, keyboards/synths, groove stations and DJ Gear throughout.

All youth will have the opportunity to enter and explore music industry career paths - from artist to producer to manager.

"Connecting young people with mentorship and helping them find their spark, especially through music, has always been part of what we do," said Running Rebels Executive Director Victor Barnett. "So a partnership with Notes for Notes was a

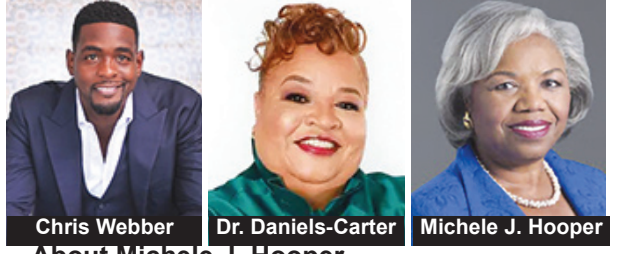

Retiring Christ The King Baptist Church pastor, Rev. John McVicker, skillfully balanced community activism with powerful teaching of the Word!



Milwaukee will soon lose one of its most influential pastors and community activists when Rev. John W. McVicker, Sr., departs for Atlanta later this summer.

Rev. McVicker bid a tearful farewell to his congregants and friends Friday night during the 40th Anniversary Founders Celebration and Pastoral Retirement.

The gala event, at Discovery World, drew hundreds who filled the banquet hall.

The mood was both festive and joyful until 'Rev. Mac' (as I call him) broke into tears while acknowledging his wife and First Lady, Marilynn.

Expressing his love and gratitude for her support and sacrifices made over the last 40 years, the highly regarded cleric couldn't hold back tears---even though he explained he had promised himself not to allow his emotions to overwhelm him.

His emotional display of love and admiration cemented the anniversary fete, which drew clerics from around the country as well as founding members of CTK, several of whom joined current members who interrupted Rev. Mac's speech with shouts of 'we love you, Rev.'

A similar scene took place Sunday as the cleric and community leader was again overwhelmed with emotion during his final sermon.

This time, Rev. Mac's expressions of gratitude and love were directed toward the CTK members and staff who have accompanied him on his spiritual journey.

(Fortunately, my camera covered my face, masking the tears that flowed down my cheek as his words penetrated my comfort zone.)

My wife and I joined the church over two decades ago after a short search for a new 'home on the rock.' I appreciated Rev. Mac's active role as a champion of educational options for Black children.

His most noteworthy campaign was champion-

A Citation of Commendation was given by State Senator LaTonya Johnson along with a Citation by the Senate presented by state Sen. Dora Drake to pay tribute to Ms. Rose Marie Lue-Hing, honoring her "fierce commitment to civic engagement."

The celebration continued with WNOV 860 radio talk show host Michelle Bryant, Say Something Real Talk who honored Mz. Rose by presenting an Executive Proclamation by Milwaukee County Executive David Crowley.

Bryant exclaimed Mz. Rose had an "informed and powerful voice" that could be heard daily on many local and national radio stations including

Al Sharpton's syndicated radio talk show, 'Keepin' It Real.'

During these calls, Mz. Rose held elected officials accountable and gave commentary that made them "answer to, explain and provide information" that called for change. Bryant and her WNOV team did a superb job in highlighting Mz. Rose's life and legacy throughout the week and weekend.

Mz. Rose was more than a community icon — she was community. Born in Milwaukee on August 30, 1938, her life was steeped in purpose, faith, and passion. She broke barriers at WE Energies as the first Black woman Contract Analyst in her department. She stood tall as a Union

Steward for IBEW Local 2150, fighting for equity long before it was fashionable. And after retirement, she showed the world that learning never stops — earning her degrees from MATC and the University of Wisconsin-Madison.

She was a storyteller, actress, singer, dancer, and activist. A proud alum of St. Benedict de Moor Boarding School, she stayed connected with fellow alumni, keeping the legacy alive with annual reunions and monthly church gatherings. She was a founding force behind Harambee Community School and a tireless advocate for social justice in Milwaukee's Black and underserved communities.

Whether she was belting out hymns at 8 a.m. Mass, organizing parish events, brewing her famous coffee, or debating city policy, Mz. Rose always made her presence known. She moved with grace, but her message was firm. Do right by the people — that was her mission.

Her great love for Caribbean culture made her a familiar face at Sunday cricket matches, domino tables at the Caribbean Inn, and dance floors at every West Indies Association event. She gave newcomers to Milwaukee a warm welcome, helping them find their footing with open arms and open heart.

She was a proud grandmother to Carrington Marie Lue-Hing, a professional dancer who carries her legacy of excellence and elegance forward. Her beloved son, Michael Douglass Lue-Hing, preceded her in death, and she now joins him and other cherished family members in eternal rest.

Mz. Rose's final resting place will be on sacred family land acquired in 1883 — beside her grandmother, Mary Benton Soward in Dyersburg, TN — becoming the first to be buried there in over 90 years. It's fitting for a woman who always knew where she came from and made sure the rest of us never forgot.

When asked about her final wishes, Mz. Rose didn't hesitate. She said, "I want a celebration of life." And what a celebration it was.

She will be remembered as a truth-teller, a trailblazer, a community mother, and a proud daughter of Milwaukee.

Her voice may be silent now, but her legacy will continue to speak — in the halls of government, in the rhythms of the islands, in the churches she graced, and in the lives of all she touched.

The Executive Proclamation by David Crowley, captured the essence of Mz. Rose by saying she was "a remarkable woman who will be remembered fondly by the people of Milwaukee County for her legacy of compassion and dedication to her community."

"May the spirit of Mz. Rose live on in every voice raised for justice, every foot on the dance floor and every life lived boldly and unapologetically." Mz. Rose — your spirit lives on.

9-1-1.

He also voiced "The Producer" on the popular animated series The Magic School Bus and served as an executive producer on the show.

Warner's talents extended well beyond acting. In 2015, he won a Grammy Award for Best Traditional R&B Performance for his work on the song "Jesus Children" with Robert Glasper Experiment and Lalah Hathaway.

He was also a published poet, musician, and director, and in recent years had become an outspoken advocate for mental health, particularly in

the Black community.

Just days before his death, Warner released what would be his final episode of his podcast, 'Not All Hood,' a series focused on unpacking generational trauma, wellness, and healing within marginalized communities.

Fans and celebrities flooded social media on Sunday, expressing shock and heartbreak.

One longtime fan, 43-year-old Jalen Cooper of Washington, D.C., said, "He was more than Theo to us—he represented a generation of young Black men who finally saw themselves reflected on TV.

His voice will be missed." Warner's enduring presence in

American pop culture spanned four decades, and he remained active in film, television, music, and podcasting until his final days.

As tributes continue to pour in from across the entertainment industry and beyond, many are remembering Warner as a trailblazer who helped redefine Black manhood on screen.

Actor and director Keegan-Michael Key posted simply, "Rest easy, King. You gave us more than you know."

Warner's family has asked for privacy during this time of grief.

Funeral arrangements have not yet been made public.

Funding cuts jeopardize state's anti-smoking efforts

an all-time low for Wisconsin.

Nevertheless, work remains to be done. One of seven (16%) high schoolers currently use e-cigarettes, a 33% increase since 2017. Eighteen percent of young adults in Wisconsin currently use e-cigarettes, making up about one-third (32%) of all adult e-cigarette users in Wisconsin. These and other emerging commercial tobacco and nicotine products threaten the work that Wisconsin has achieved.



"In Wisconsin, 7,900 people die each year from tobacco use. Tobacco use also costs Americans over \$241 billion in annual health care costs. That amounts to \$1,220 per taxpaying household, whether someone in that family uses tobacco products or not. In Wisconsin, smoking costs the state over \$3 billion in direct health care costs."

The FDA's Center for Tobacco plays a critical role in preventing illegal e-cigarettes and other flavored tobacco products from entering the market and monitoring retailers. The Wisconsin quit line has helped over 200,000 in Wisconsin.

These programs are at risk of being downsized or eliminated in Wisconsin due to federal funding cuts. We express a strong objection to the elimination of the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's (CDC) Office on Smoking and Health (OSH) and staffing cuts at the Food and Drug Administration's Center for Tobacco Products (FDA/CTP) and other cuts to programs that protect public health.

In Wisconsin, 7,900 people die each year from tobacco use. Tobacco use also costs Americans over \$241 billion in annual health care costs. That amounts to \$1,220 per taxpaying household, whether someone in that family uses tobacco products or not.

In Wisconsin, smoking costs the state over \$3 billion in direct health care costs.

Tobacco use is the leading cause of preventable death in the United States and the leading cause of chronic diseases like cancer, heart disease, stroke, COPD and diabetes.

The chronic disease epidemic cannot be fully addressed in our state without the steadfast support and partnership of the CDC's OSH and the FDA.

Eliminating OSH will be a serious blow to our state's efforts to prevent and reduce tobacco use. In Fiscal Year 2024, Wisconsin received a total of \$1,588,681 in tobacco

prevention funding from OSH, including \$1,273,529 in National Tobacco Control Program funding and \$315,152 in quit line funding to help support its tobacco prevention and cessation efforts. 7 Approximately 20% of Wisconsin's FY 2024 Quitline funding was funded by CDC.

Now is the time to "say something and do something." Together, as community leaders and elected officials, we can make progress and change things to the betterment of all of us.

ing the school choice initiative, specifically protests to convince then-Governor Jim Doyle to lift the enrollment cap on the choice program.

Little did Doyle know we (supporters of the choice initiative) had an insider provide us with his schedule, allowing us to demonstrate outside his high-profile events.

Rev. Mac led many of those protests, with some suggesting the demonstrations embarrassed the governor into reconsidering his opposition to increasing the number of choice participants.

McVicker was also a founding member of the Black Alliance for Educational Options and used his powerful voice to advocate for school choice nationwide.

Several months ago, I authored a column on his quest to have a young pre-teen adjudicated in the juvenile system rather than the adult penal system. The now 12-year-old was charged with killing his mother after she refused to purchase a video game when he was 10.

Noting the boy would not be 'rehabilitated' in an adult prison, and most likely would be subjected to sexual violence, the 'Mac Man' noted adult incarceration would "compound the trauma imposed by their isolation and separation from family, friends and community."

Sexual assaults, he noted, of children often lead to suicide.

Without dismissing the seriousness of his crime, the CTK pastor recommended that the child and community would be better served in a juvenile setting where he would receive counseling and true rehabilitative services.

The Northside cleric's use of the child's case was endemic to a larger crisis.

Rev. Mac was at the vanguard of numerous civil rights causes. Due to his position as the leader of the largest Black Baptist church in the state, his voice carried significant influence and frequently resulted in positive responses.

One local politician once theorized that Rev. Mac's endeavors carried more weight than the NAACP.

Rev. Mac's community activism, coupled with

his powerful teaching of the Word, made for a perfect spiritual marriage for my wife and me.

That fact, along with a congregation totally committed to outreach and scripture growth, was the icing on the cake.

During the last six years, I have split time between CTK and the House of Grace Ministries, which is pastored by my sister, Rev. Dr. Debbie Thomas, and her husband, Rev. Clarence Thomas.

My brother, Rev. John Holt, is an associate minister. Most of the church members are relatives

who hold ministerial leadership positions within the church.

As a small church, which utilizes a virtual paradigm, there is a level of intimacy that is generally lost in larger congregations, including CTK. However, the uniqueness of the mini-mega church offsets its limitations in terms of capacity.

Under Rev. Mac's leadership, the church hosts a grade school, which was run by Marilyn, and a comprehensive Quality of Life Center that serves the immediate community around 60th and Bradley Road.

Indeed, Rev. Mac's vision and administrative skills have made CTK a hallmark in the community, in addition to serving as a spiritual vehicle for its members and guests. Rarely does a week pass without guests including prominent politicians, civic leaders, and professional athletes.

CTK was founded in April 1985 with 39 founding members. Initially housed at the Vel Philips Center on 21st Street, the congregation soon moved into its first home on West Leon Terrace.

Within a decade, however, and as a result of sig-

Association of Physicians of Indian Origin to establish a Free Adult Primary Care Clinic, and its Samaritan project connects children with incarcerated parents.

Those were the most obvious projects. Many other internal ministries were tasked with impacting the social service and spiritual gamut, from programs for seniors to the establishment of a housing corporation.

The McVickers were the catalyst, steadfastly assisting or initiating projects to benefit the congregants and the community.

Marilynn was also a key participant in several of the church choirs, where she provided her voice on Sundays in her final performance.

I have previously expressed my hesitancy to join a megachurch. But the community of faithful—a family—under Rev. Mac's leadership swayed me. As I noted, I still attend my family church, recognizing the benefit of open participation and family fellowship.

Uniquely, we can pose questions following sermons and engage in dialogue among the faithful.

And since I am taking graduate courses in theology, I frequently seek assistance from Rev. Debbie toward interpreting or debating scripture.

I sometimes find myself leaning toward deism, but I'm anchored by my association with a Baptist and CME church paradigm.

Rev. Debbie, although of similar age to Rev. Mac, is far from retirement. As for 'Shepherd' McVicker, his 'flock' feeds off the nourishment he has provided for 40 years.

Indeed, his leadership and voice have fed the multitudes throughout our city.

In his final sermon, the esteemed cleric declared that he didn't perform miracles during his tenure, but instead was a vessel for the truth of Jesus' Words and mission.

It was a fitting final exaltation. One could say that his legacy is that he successfully walked the path and spread the Word. And the seeds he planted will continue to benefit our city despite his absence. **Hotep.**

MLK Jr's daughter tells Trump 'now do the Epstein files' after 230,000 pages released on civil rights leader

Rev. Martin Luther King Jr.'s daughter has urged Donald Trump to release the full, unredacted Jeffrey Epstein files after thousands of documents surrounding the civil rights activist's assassination were unsealed.

Bernice King, 62, issued a blunt request to the president after Director of National Intelligence Tulsi Gabbard announced the release of more than 230,000 pages tied to MLK's 1968 murder, promising "complete transparency" over the case.

"Now, do the Epstein files," King tweeted on Monday evening, along with a photograph of her father.

King, who was five when her father was assassinated, and her brother Martin Luther King III, said in a joint statement: "While we support transparency and historical accountability, we object to any attacks on our father's legacy or attempts to weaponize it to spread falsehoods."

Some civil rights activists rejected claims that the Trump administration was pursuing true transparency.

The King Center, which is now led by Bernice King, framed the release of documents as a distraction.

"It is unfortunate and ill-timed, given the myriad of pressing issues and injustices affecting the United States and the global society," it said.

Rev. Al Sharpton said in a statement that Trump's unsealing of the MLK assassination files was "not about transparency or justice."

"It's a desperate attempt to distract people from the firestorm engulfing Trump over the Epstein files and the public unraveling of his credibility among the Maga base," he added.

The documents on the murder of the civil rights leader were posted as Trump faces mounting pressure to release all documents related to Epstein's sex trafficking investigation.

The president continues to face MAGA backlash after his administration concluded earlier this month that there was no evidence the convicted sex offender maintained a "client list."

Trump has repeatedly framed the issue as a "hoax" perpetrated by Democrats.

The Democrats, in return, said that Trump is attempting to distract from the scandal, including by peddling a conspiracy theory that former President Barack Obama orchestrated the Russia investigation into Trump's 2016 campaign.

House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries told reporters on Monday that Trump is "running scared."

"Why do we think President Joe Biden or President Barack Obama's names are being invoked?," he said. "Because Donald Trump is running scared."

A day after the Wall Street Journal's bombshell report that Trump allegedly sent a bawdy 50th birthday card to Epstein, the president asked the court to unseal grand jury transcripts in the prosecution of Epstein and his former girlfriend, Ghislaine Maxwell.

A former prosecutor said that the document release is unlikely to produce much, if anything, and is a move to "present himself as if he's doing something here and it really is nothing."
