The Medical College of Wisconsin (MCW) Cancer Center's inaugural Audacity bike ride is uniting researchers, cancer patients and survivors, doctors, families, and the entire community in a bold mission to end cancer.

Set for Sunday, August 17, 2025, at American Family Field, the event has already galvanized more than 800 participants and over 100 teams from across Wisconsin and beyond.

Momentum has been building for months through grassroots fundraising, community events, and a shared commitment to accelerate lifesaving cancer research.

Local businesses, community groups, and individuals are rallying behind the movement.

Since the ride was announced in January, Audacity has inspired everyday people to lead extraordinary fundraising efforts, driven by the fact that 100% of the funds raised will go directly to advancing groundbreaking research happening at the MCW Cancer Center.

Across the state, teams have hosted bake sales, dunk tanks, food truck fundraisers, cocktail events, and even baseball game takeovers.

These collective efforts reflect how all people can be part of the mission to eradicate cancer in Wisconsin and across the nation.

"Every day, our researchers are racing against time to deliver solutions that transform lives," said Gustavo Leone, PhD, director of the Medical College of Wisconsin Cancer Center. "Cancer is relentless, but so are we—we're determined to drive discoveries that change its trajectory and create a future where this dis-

ease is no longer in control.

Audacity is an inspiring example of how a united community can amplify that work."

Cancer remains one of the leading causes of death in Wisconsin—overall incidence and mortality rates are above the national average and persistent disparities in care and outcomes exist among underserved populations.

According to the National Cancer Institute, the Black and American Indian/Alaska Native populations in Wisconsin continue to experience higher cancer incidence and mortality rates than the White Non-Hispanic population, often due to limited access to care and later-stage diagnoses.

The MCW Cancer Center is addressing these challenges head-on, pioneering innovative research that is reshaping how cancer is detected, diagnosed, and treated.

By participating in Audacity—whether riding, volunteering, or fundraising—supporters are helping drive cancer research discoveries that can save lives.

"We are excited to join the fight to end cancer, right here in Wisconsin," said Andy Harmening, president and CEO of Associated Bank, Audacity's founding sponsor.

"This event is a testament to what can be accomplished together to directly impact our friends, families, and local communities."

For participants like Nelson Williams, CEO of Briohn Building and volunteer co-chair of Audacity, the ride is not just about the miles, it is about making a difference for the people he loves.

As one of the most impactful pieces of legislation in American history, the 60th anniversary of the Voting Rights Act should be a time of celebration.

Now, instead of celebrating the advancements of American democracy, communities across the country find themselves in the middle of a multi-generational attack on the franchise and all the other rights that flow from it.

Signed into law by President Lyndon Johnson on Aug. 6, 1965, the Voting Rights Act offered the first real promise of full political participation for Black Americans across the South.

The safeguards and protections established by the Voting Rights Act of 1965 paved the way for a more representative government that began to reflect the will of the people, by the people.

Civil Rights groups have commemorated the day, reflecting on the resilience and determination of our predecessors, as we face an increasingly hostile anti-democracy minority running recklessly across the federal government.

Despite efforts to restore and expand the protections afforded by the Voting Rights Act of 1965, the moral clarity from 60 years ago is lacking in congressional leadership.

Ahead of the landmark anniversary, Sen. Reverend Raphael Warnock, supported by the Senate Democratic Caucus, reintroduced the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act.

If passed, the John Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act would restore geographic pre-clearance under an updated formula, create new nationwide practices of pre-clearance for voting practices with known discriminatory effects. It would further bolster protections against vote dilution, denial, and abridgment as we've seen in many states post-Shelby County v. Holder.

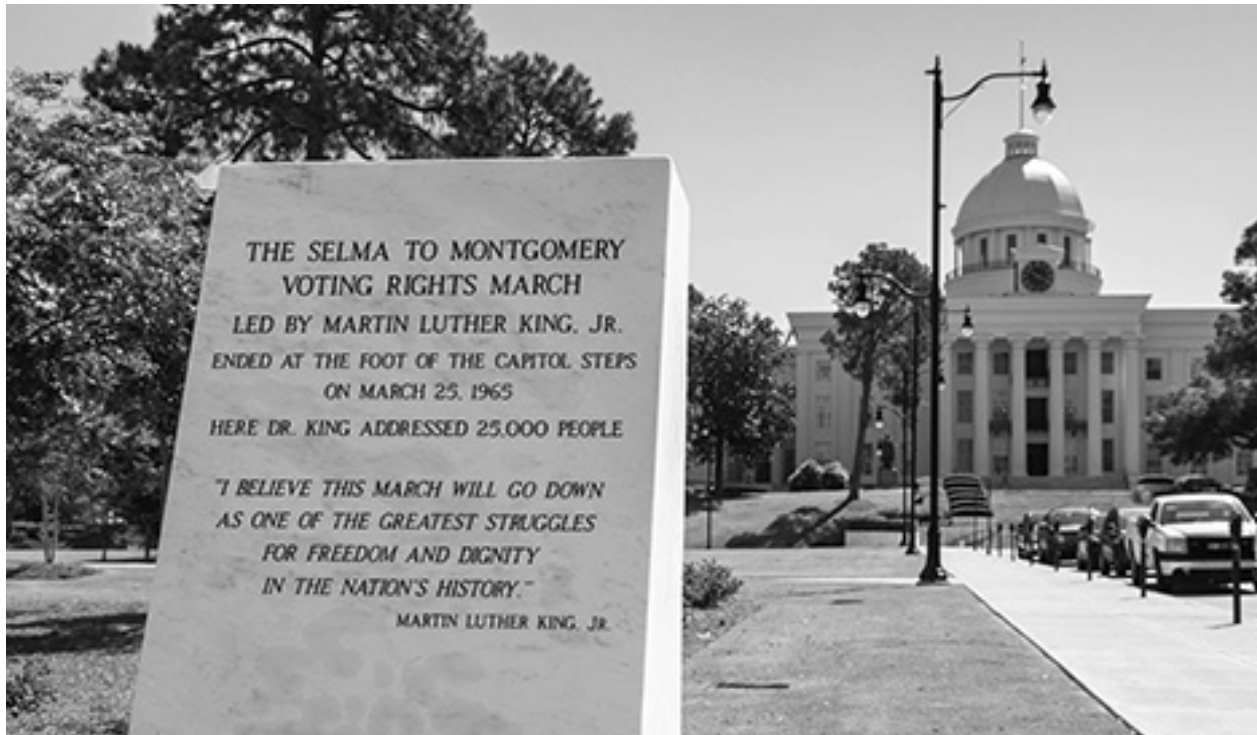
According to the Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights, over 200 civil rights and democracy organizations signed on in support of the reintroduction of the John R. Lewis Voting Rights Advancement Act in the Senate.

"Extremists who prefer a White, Christian and male controlled country don't mind destroying our rights to see a return to the days when Black people, Latinos, Asian Americans and Native Americans could be blocked from the ballot but told it's not due to racism," said Maya Wiley, president and CEO of The Leadership Conference on Civil and Human Rights.

"We are not just celebrating 60 years of voting rights, we're calling out more than a decade of deliberate harm aimed at voters of color."

According to Wiley, overcoming the expansive and arguably unconstitutional overreach that undermines our rights requires the passage of a suite of pro-democracy reforms, including the Freedom to Vote Act, the Native American Voting Rights Act, and the DC statehood bill.

She said this freedom package was necessary to protect our communities and hold "anti-voter"

politicians accountable.

"Those in power see the rise of a multiracial democracy as a threat, and they are doing everything they can to silence it," Wiley said.

"We will keep rising up and speaking out for the fundamental right to decide who represents us and what they do with our

power."

Texas mid-decade power grab is about denying Black political power

And yet, at the state level, community coalitions are stepping up efforts to combat the growing reach of authoritarianism on multiple fronts.

Texas has grabbed the national

attention as Republicans steeped in white entitlement and resentment demand five extra congressional seats as they further deny and restrict Black voters' right to fair representation.

With over four million Black Texans, the largest Black population in the country, it's unsurprising that the Lone Star State is

ground zero for the latest Republican scheme.

Speaking with NewsOne about the politically motivated mid-decade redistricting effort, Resha Thomas, project director for the Texas Black Action Fund, said the move was grounded in fear.

"We are not even in our final stages on the maps that were redistricted in 2021," Thomas said. "It's a fear from those who have been used to retaining power in the state of Texas."

Fear of Black power and political representation has long been a driving force of anti-democracy factions in this country. It's part of why the Voting Rights Act was even needed in 1965, despite the passage of the 15th Amendment nearly 100 years earlier.

"If they're able to succeed in the state of Texas, they are looking to do this in other states," she said.

Thomas said, calling the Texas mid-decade power grab an attack "not only on access to voting, but representation."

"It's like who do you call when you have a veteran who's seeking services?" she said. "It means if you have concerns or issues around your SNAP benefits or Medicaid, having limited resources of having someone answer that phone and help advocate for you."

The current far-right assault on democracy follows a calculated decades-long attack on the federal courts that paved the way for this moment. But a disingenuous opinion by Supreme Court Chief Justice John Roberts in Shelby County, claiming the end of dis-

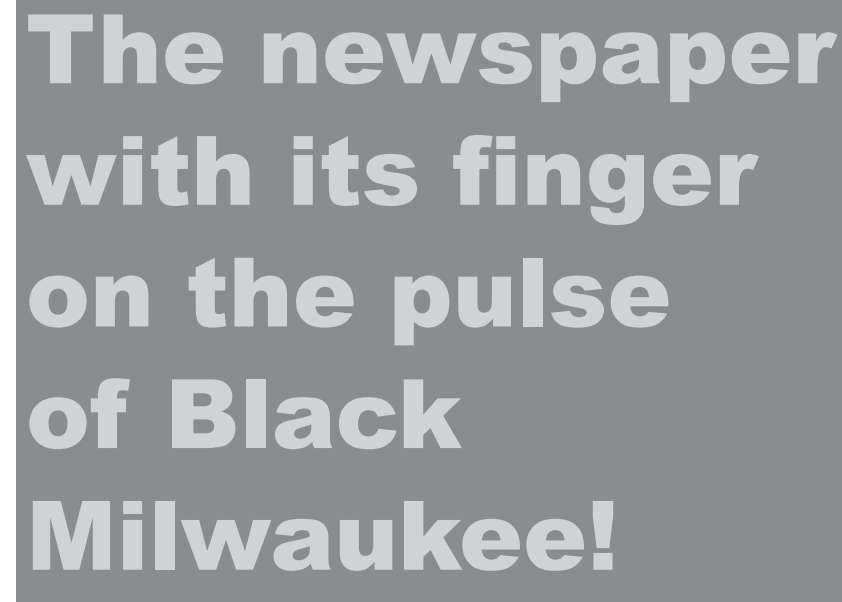

Op-Ed: 300,000 Black Women Left Or Were Pushed Out Of The Workforce

It is distressing that in a single quarter, more than 300,000 Black women left or were pushed out of the workforce, according to data from the U.S. Bureau of Labor Statistics. In other words, within a mere 90 days, hundreds of thousands of heads of households, parents, caregivers, and contributors to the local economy lost their livelihoods.

Many lost their jobs due to cuts by the Department of Government Efficiency (DOGE) and attacks on diversity, equity, and inclusion.

Add the 300,000 Black women who recently lost their jobs to the more than 518,000 Black women who have not returned to the workforce since the COVID-19 pandemic, and you'll have a fuller picture of the economic devastation facing Black women and Black families. For instance, the unemployment rate for Black women is over

6.4%. The national average is 4.1%.

Those of us with even a rudimentary understanding of labor statistics note that monthly labor data doesn't include those who have given up looking for work. It merely tracks those who report being unemployed week over week. This means unemployment figures for Black women may be higher.

And yet, I've seen very few broadcast or print stories profiling these women, or highlighting how they're processing federal cuts and job loss. In fact, there have been few humanizing stories that illustrate the painful choices facing these women. What is more, in the instances where broadcast or cable networks have reported on this story, the people interviewed are rarely working-class Black women. For this reason, I question whether the nation has a true picture of who is impacted.

Those of us who have lived in the D.C., Maryland, and Virginia area, where many of the cuts were concentrated, have an idea of who is affected. I imagine that the impacted Black women have worked for the federal government for years, take pride in a job well done, contribute to their local economy,

are raising or have raised families, and want to make a difference. But I would love to see more coverage that illustrates who these women are and how they are coping with the cuts.

And even if we can't see their faces, we can see our own. This is key because all of us will be impacted by the policies that have led to these and other cuts. What is more, the decline in Black women's labor force participation in the last three months alone has resulted in a 37 billion drop in the Gross Domestic Product, according to gender economist Katica Roy.

This news is paired in intensity with the devastating gender pay gap. Black women working full-time, year-round are paid 66 cents for every dollar earned by white, non-Hispanic men. In more ways than one, the revelation of the hundreds of thousands of Black women who are no longer in the workforce hurts.

While some Black women have or will pursue entrepreneurial ventures, others will not. But even entrepreneurship is not a silver bullet if the business does not scale or grow.

While some Black women may have accepted early retirement offers, most did not. The vast majority of Black women who lost their jobs in the last quarter will have fewer resources to care for themselves and their families, contribute to the local economy, fund their retirement, or pass on generational wealth. Many will need assistance with health care, child care, education, and other supports at the exact time the federal government is cutting those lifeline resources.

What is more, in the United States at least, Black women are often a source of derision. The mansosphere hates women but reserves a particular disdain for Black women. Just consider the memes circulating on social media any given week. When a person wants to make fun of Black culture, they don a ridiculous dress, throw on a messy wig, apply copious amounts of lipstick and make a mockery out of our existence.

Whether by intent or impact, Black women continue to suffer disproportionately in terms of economic mobility, pay equity, health disparities and so many other markers of well-being. Our plight isn't offset by the fact that Black women are among the most educated demographics in the nation.

Persons who want to see the nation do well must see this data as a beckoning call for gender and race-conscious policies. If policy is race-neutral, I fear it will explicitly harm marginalized communities. That won't move the nation forward, as our fates are intertwined. Black women may feel the pain of cuts first, but we are often a harbinger of what is to come for others.

Now is the time to make all of our community whole, including Black women. There simply is no other way.

crimination as we knew it in 1965, gave Texas and several other Republican controlled states free rein to get back into the disenfranchisement business. Trump and his cronies are simply exploiting the loopholes and chaos the Roberts court has inflicted on the very institutions meant to serve the people.

"What we're telling folks is there's a lot to come," Thomas said. "We've just finished six and a half, almost seven months of this new administration. We still got years to go."

Protecting the right to vote can't be wrapped in respectability and comfort

If the need for doing more than just showing up to vote wasn't clear before, hopefully, people are finally getting the message loud and clear. For Tiffany Roberts, public policy director for the Southern Center for Human Rights, the long road ahead has been fortified by movement groundwork that laid the foundation for passing critical legislation, such as the Voting Rights Act.

As she reflected on the act's 60th anniversary, Roberts called for people to reconnect with why our ancestors fought for the right to vote.

"We've reduced it to just literally going to the ballot box," she said. "But we've forgotten that the point of it is for the place where we live and raise our families to reflect our values and our dignity."

For Roberts, part of the shift also requires people to understand that we cannot simply focus on the right to vote alone. The right to vote exists in direct relationship with all the other rights and issues that flow from it.

She also challenged people's complacency and acceptance of restrictions on core freedoms, such as the right to protest and free speech, which has paved the way for where we are now.

"We will talk about the dire straits that we are in and still believe that our advocacy must be comfortable," Roberts said.

"If the state is unchecked, that means that the power of life and death is in the hands of people who really only wanted us to labor for free and build the wealth of this economy under draconian conditions."
